reimbursement would result in an inefficient use of the funds or otherwise be contrary to the

proposed changes properly reflect the Commission's long-standing existing practice of reviewing

and auditing all USF requests from qualifying telecommunications corporations to determine that

the costs for which reimbursement is sought, in each application, are reasonable and prudent

costs incurred by the qualifying telecommunications corporations in providing basic

telecommunications service at just, reasonable, and affordable rates, and that the USF funds are

used efficiently and in the public interest.

Because the proposed amendment to R746-360 serves to clarify the existing practice,

URTA supports the Amendment to R746-360 proposed by the Commission.
