Dear Mr. Walje:

Several days ago I asked Mr. Greg Monson, PacifiCorp's counsel in the above matter whether he was also representing ScottishPower in that case. He informed me that he is not, which raised the issue of whether ScottishPower had been served with notice of the proceeding. In checking with the Department of Commerce, we were advised that ScottishPower has not registered in Utah and has no Utah registered agent. I then contacted Sandy Mooy at the PSC to determine whether the PSC has the name of a ScottishPower Utah officer (which the company agreed to maintain in the 1999 sale order) who is authorized to accept service of process. Sandy advised me, after checking with PacifiCorp, that he was informed that you are ScottishPower's official representative in Utah. I also contacted Mr. Brian Burnett, who was counsel for ScottishPower in the sale case, to determine whether he still represents the company. He told me that he does not represent ScottishPower, but that he believed Stoel Rives does.

I am enclosing a Notice of the Filing, together with a copy of the Request for Agency Action, which requires ScottishPower's response. As the Notice states, I have also Fedexed the same documents to Mr. Ian Russell in Glasgow. If you are not authorized to accept service for ScottishPower, I would appreciate it if you would provide me with the name and address of the person who is so authorized, either in Utah or in Scotland.
