 advancing renewable energy and energy efficiency in Utah and the West. We
 work with diverse stakeholders and in a number of venues to advance clean
 energy resources.

Q: What is the nature of your comments?

Utah Clean Energy and a number of our stakeholders, including the Agricultural community, are interested in the development of community-scale renewable energy projects in Utah. Community-scale projects are generally less than or equal to 20 MW in size. These projects benefit rural economies while providing clean inexhaustible energy to the ratepayers. It was brought to our attention that some of PacifiCorp's contract terms for Wasatch Wind's community-scale wind project are onerous for small scale projects and could prevent community-scale renewable energy development in Utah. Although Utah Clean Energy has not been privy to contract negotiations, we have reviewed the testimony of Todd Velnosky, Business Development Manger, John Deer Wind Energy. We support Todd Velosky's comments and ask the Utah Public Service Commission to evaluate these contract barriers in their ruling on this docket. Furthermore, we support the development of
