On August 3, 2007 I and David Ward had a meeting with President Walje and Paul Padokovich of Rocky Mountain Power. We met for the purpose of resolving the issues brought before the Public Service Commission of Utah.

The two hour meeting was amicable and very productive. As a result Rocky Mountain Power agreed to various stipulations which were specific to my complaint of February 27,2007. They have signed a document agreeing to those stipulations. Rocky Mountain Power will submit to you a document signed by my attorney (David 0. Drake) agreeing to such.

With Rocky Mountain Power now being autonomous from PacifiCorp, (as of March 2007) Rocky Mountain Power will be able to re-establish itself as a reliable, efficient electrical utility. It is my belief that the analysis of William's Consulting, will still be important and valuable to the PSC and to Rocky Mountain Power.

As a result of the good faith negotiation with Rocky Mountain Power, which in no-way represented a buy-out to achieve such agreement, I am asking the PSC to drop the action initiated by my complaint represented as Docket No. 07-03-08. I think that with the agreement achieved there will be no need for a Technical Conference hearing, which was scheduled for August 16, 2007.

For your information, I have essential surgery scheduled for August 16^{th} . If you feel the conference must go forward please let me know.

I want to thank Administrative Judge Steve Goodwill for his objective and efficient service with regard to my complaint. I also want to thank all of the PSC, the Division of Utilities, and Committee on Consumer Services for their assistance to include discovery processes with Rocky Mountain Power.
