- 1. Yes, the Company proposes that the Customer Load Charge (CLC) will be treated in the same manner as other billings. Specifically,

- a. The 1,000 kWh will be based on the billing cycle usage during the summer billing months from May through September and it will be prorated if the numbers of days in the billing cycle is either less than 26 or greater than 34.
- b. Yes, the CLC may be imposed based on estimated meter readings if any of the meter readings are estimated from billing months May through September.
