Subject: Docket No 09-035-T11: Schedule 113 – Rocky Mountain Power Evaporative Cooling and Central Air Conditioning Incentive Program (Cool Cash Incentive Program)

In its June 10, 2009 order, Docket No. 09-035-T05, the Public Service Commission (Commission) approved Rocky Mountain Power's (Company) proposed modifications to Schedule 113 – Cool Cash Incentive Program. In that order the Company was directed to work with the Office of Consumer Services (Office) regarding the language on Third Revision of Sheet No. 113.3, describing the limits on incentives paid to customers. The Office had expressed concerns that the language needed to be more precise to avoid possible misinterpretation.

On July 23, 2009, in compliance with the Commission's order, the Company filed proposed language modifications in the Cool Cash Program tariff. The Office believes this language clearly identifies limitations on the incentives eligible customers may receive under the Program. The Office recommends the Commission approve the tariff language modifications.
