Dear PSC,

I read about the 13.7% increase in electric power rates proposed by Rocky Mountain Power in the January 28, 2011 edition of The Salt Lake Tribune. I am retired and on a fixed income. I have not had cost of living increase in social security income in two years. Yet my electric power rates have increased last year and the year before.

**While I understand that the cost of supplying power and maintaining equipment does go up; the cost increase should not be born on the backs of people who can least afford it. Therefore, I ask that you decline Rocky Mountain Power's proposal.**

In lieu of 13.7% on residential customers, I think an increase of 3% is possible. I think industrial and commercial users should pay more than residential users. I am very aware of how much power I use. I am on a budget and use an equal pay plan. I read my bill every month and follow the month over month trending in my use. I respect this resource and I conserve usage when I can.
