Pursuant to Utah Code Ann. § 63G-4-207 and Utah Admin. Code § R746-100-7, Frontier Communications Corporation (“Frontier”), on behalf of its affiliates Citizens Telecommunications Company of Utah (“CTC-UT”) and Navajo Communications Company, Inc. (“Navajo”), petitions the Public Service Commission (“Commission”) for leave to intervene in the above-entitled matter. In support of its petition Frontier states as follows:

1. CTC-UT and Navajo are local exchange carriers which provide public telecommunications services pursuant to certificates of public convenience and necessity issued by this Commission and which attach cable facilities to Rocky Mountain Power’s utility poles to provide public telecommunications services.

2. On April 26, 2010, Rocky Mountain Power requested an order from the Commission pursuant to Utah Admin. Code R746-345-3 approving a standard form Non-Reciprocal Pole Attachment Agreement (the “Agreement”) for Rocky Mountain Power to use with cable and telecommunications companies seeking to attach facilities to the Rocky Mountain Power’s distribution poles.

3. The Commission invited comments from interested parties to be filed by May 17, 2010 and subsequently extended the comment period to June 15, 2010. Frontier submitted comments on Rocky Mountain Power's proposed contract June 15, 2010.

4. On July 27, 2010, the Commission held a scheduling conference in which it established a schedule and expanded this proceeding to include both standard non-reciprocal and reciprocal pole attachment agreements with Rocky Mountain Power. Frontier participated in this scheduling conference.

5. Frontier and its local exchange carrier affiliates CTC-UT and Navajo have a significant interest in the above-captioned matter and their legal interests may be substantially affected by the outcome.

6. Frontier's intervention and participation in this matter will not materially impair the prompt and orderly conduct of these proceedings.
