Dear Mr. Taylor:

It appears certain information was not provided with Rocky Mountain Power's August 10, 2012, application (August Application) filed in Docket No. 11-035-104, "In the Matter of the Investigation into Extending and Expanding the Solar Incentive Program and Possible Development of an Ongoing Program."

In the Commission's Order dated October 7, 2009, in Docket No. 09-035-27, (October Order) the Commission approved use of the demand side management (DSM) cost benefit tests to evaluate small-scale renewable resources, such as solar photovoltaic projects. Further, on page 3 of the Commission's order dated March 6, 2007, in Docket No. 07-035-T04, the Commission required all future DSM tariff applications to contain "the models used to calculate the benefit cost ratio for each measure... along with the inputs and a list of assumptions used... as part of the tariff approval filing."

The Company's August Application contains the results of the tests but no models or underlying data. The Commission intended for the Company to include this supporting data in all applications using the DSM cost-effectiveness tests. Therefore, please file this information by September 11, 2012.
