I write to express my strong support for Utah rooftop solar customers, and my opposition to Rocky Mountain Power's proposed fee increase of \$4.25 per month targeting these customers.

The issue here is not how to make the fees exactly fair for each user. If it were, we should first address the subsidies received by the coal, oil, and natural gas industries.

Second, we should charge a fee on coal-generated electricity, accurately reflecting the social and environmental costs of the air pollution it generates.

Electricity produced from solar photovoltaics promotes local jobs, helps our energy independence, and leads to cleaner local air. Most importantly - it moves us away from carbon dioxide emissions which endanger the planet.

We are going to have to move away from burning fossil fuels in very short order. The sooner we begin, the cheaper it will be. Utah's rooftop solar customers are playing a critical role in moving us in the right direction.

Rocky Mountain Power should be doing everything it can to assist them, not coming up with new disincentives to put in their way.
