I am very much opposed to any fee on residential customers installing rooftop solar power. The articles in the media by Rocky Mountain power "justifying" such a fee seem not in the public interest and instead their arguments support increased profits for Rocky Mountain.

I would ask the Commission instead to undertake a study and implementation of increased subsidies for residentially and commercially installed solar as a way to reduce the need for more polluting power generating plants and solar installations by Rocky Mountain. This seems to be the way many other states and other countries help consumers pay for electrical services generating a pollution cost. Given the pollution problem in the Salt Lake Valley we need to encourage more rather than less residential solar power generation. The public's interest is not to increase Rocky Mountain's profitability but rather to decrease the power costs to consumers and industry.
