I am opposed to the current proposed \$4 Rocky Mountain Power charge for customers that are net-metering. I do understand their position, however, I would like to see a concession in return for this charge. Currently, those using solar panels and other forms of net metering must pay Rocky Mountain Power if they consume more power in a given month than they have accrued credits. Example: I produce 1000 kWh in April but only use 900 kWh, I have a credit of 100 kWh moving forward. In May I use 1200 kWh but only produce 1000 kWh. I would use my 100 kWh credit, but then must pay for the other 100 kWh immediately. The problem I have with this is that at the end of March my credits from the entire year are wiped out and I start again at zero. I would like to see one of the following two concessions in place:

A. Allow for credits and debits to carry over until March. Meaning that if I were to owe money from the above example for the month of May, I could carry that amount over in hopes that I would use less power or produce more. This creates a fair accounting in March and removes the monthly overage advantage from RMP.

B. Remove the March reset so credits are allowed to build and cover overages.
