Dear Mr. Parker,

On October 17, 2014, the Utah Division of Public Utilities (Division) filed a memorandum requesting the Commission make available its model from Rocky Mountain Power's general rate case in Docket No. 13-035-184. The Division described its understanding that during the general rate case, the Commission developed its own model to evaluate Rocky Mountain Power's application and the positions of intervening parties. Specifically, the Division requested the Commission provide the Division and possibly other interested parties an electronic copy of the model.

On October 23, 2014, the Commission issued a notice of filing and comment period inviting comments by November 14, 2014, on the Division's request. On November 13, 2014, UAE Intervention Group filed comments and on November 14, 2014, the Office of Consumer Services (Office) and Rocky Mountain Power filed comments. UAE and the Office supported the Division's request and all three parties requested an electronic copy of the model. The Office also requested all supporting model specifications and documentation if available. No party opposed the Division's request.

In response to the request of these parties, receiving no opposition to the requests, and having no pending decisions in Docket No. 13-035-184, the Commission grants the requests for the electronic copy of its model used in Docket No. 13-035-184. This model is provided as is; it is benchmarked to Rocky Mountain Power's direct testimony on both jurisdictional and class results. It is updated to reflect Rocky Mountain Power's rebuttal testimony on jurisdictional results. It also reflects the jurisdictional results under the stipulation. The Commission will post an electronic copy of the model in Docket No. 13-035-184.

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Historically, this model has been used by the Commission to evaluate the effects of variable-input changes in various dockets. No other assumptions about the use of the model by the Commission in past cases, or cases going forward, can be made.
