PETITION TO INTERVENE OF THE ALLIANCE FOR SOLAR CHOICE

Pursuant to Utah Code Ann. § 63G-4-207 and Utah Admin. Code § R746-100-7, The Alliance for Solar Choice ("TASC") hereby petitions for leave to intervene in the above-captioned proceeding before the Public Service Commission of Utah ("Commission"). In support, TASC states as follows:

- 1. The Commission's *Report and Order* in Docket No. 13-035-184, issued on August 29, 2014, established this docket for consideration and development of an analytical framework to evaluate the relative costs and benefits of the net metering program.
- 2. On March 19, 2015, the Commission issued the *First Order Amending Scheduling Order and Notices of Workgroup Meetings, Hearing and Public Witness Hearing* and set a deadline of April 2, 2015 for petitions for intervention by parties that wish to participate in confidential settlement meetings.

- 3. The Alliance for Solar Choice ("TASC") leads advocacy across the country for the rooftop solar industry. Founded by the largest rooftop solar companies in the United States, TASC represents the vast majority of the rooftop solar market nationwide. Its members include Demeter Power, Silevo, SolarCity, Solar Universe, Sunrun, Verengo, and ZEP.
- 4. TASC was formed on the belief that consumer's should have the option to switch to onsite solar power for at least a portion of their energy supply. Accordingly, TASC is committed to defending policies, such as net metering, that provide fair credit to residents, businesses, churches, schools, and public agencies when their rooftop solar systems export power to a utility's grid.
- 5. TASC intervened and was granted party status in Docket No. 13-035-184, a general rate case proceeding where Rocky Mountain Power sought authority to impose a fixed charge on net metering customers. In that case, TASC presented testimony supporting the establishment of a separate proceeding to develop an analytical framework to be used to determine the costs and benefits of the net metering program. TASC's position was and is that the Commission must make a determination of the costs and benefits of the net metering program before it can approve a charge that solely applies to net metering customers.
- 6. TASC has a direct and continuing interest in the development of such a framework, as the Commission is likely to use the framework to determine whether future net metering rate proposals are just and reasonable. The development of the analytical framework directly impacts TASC's central purpose of defending policies that

provide fair credit to utility customers for electricity that is exported from their rooftop solar systems and support the sustained growth of the market for solar services.

7. TASC's interest in the outcome of these proceedings will not be adequately represented by any other party and TASC's participation will not broaden the scope of issues or delay the conduct of this proceeding. TASC's Petition to Intervene is timely filed. TASC's participation will promote the public's interest in a robust market for customer-sited solar energy in the state of Utah.
