TO: The Public Service Commission and Gary Widerburg, PSC Commission Secretary

I am concerned about how the PSC is handling letters and emails from the very members of the *public* that the commission is meant to represent and serve. Please allow me to suggest that the PSC revert back to posting *individual* submissions on all of its dockets, including on **Docket Number: 14-035-114.** There is tremendous public interest in the issues the PSC considers and I believe that periodically posting only a non-searchable PDF compilation of recently received individual submissions falsely represents the degree of public concern about these matters (in addition to not providing interested readers with certain information included in the submissions, such as hyperlinks to information the PSC and other readers should consider). It is curious that Mr. Widerburg's reply to Mike and Laurie Madsen would be posted separately on **Docket Number: 14-035-114**, while other letters and emails are not accorded equal standing.

Moreover, the public's submissions regarding **Docket Number 13-035-184** also should be posted **Docket Number: 14-035-114** as the latter docket essentially is a continuation of the former. By excluding these earlier comments from **Docket Number: 14-035-114**, the PSC not only appears to undervalue the public's views on matters of tremendous societal, environmental, and economic import, but it essentially is requiring numerous individuals and organizations to recontact the PSC in order to repeat their standpoints.
