In May of 2015 I installed a solar power system on my shop/storage building here in Moab.

The system is a 30 panel, 9300 watt system, and was qualified for the Rocky Mountain Power assistance, (which I am still waiting for). I am generating from 1300 kwh to 1600+ kwh per month, and using from 40 to 160 kwh per month, which leaves with a huge credit of kwh every month. As of September billing, I have 4040 kwh credit, (4 months) which I now find expires with the March of 2016 billing. In talking with Rocky Mountain power, they tell me if I don't use the accumulated credits, I just loose them all, and start over. They actually suggested that I "use more power", or buy more equipment that uses lots of electricity.

I don't know if this policy, of loosing all credits, is an internal one with Rocky Mountain Power, and/or if it is approved by the commission?

The reason I invested in the solar system, was to save me money of course, but also I thought it was the socially responsible thing to do. Now, it seems like it's almost a negative. I am ok with contributing more power to the grid than I use, but this seems excessive.

Instead of just complaining, I wonder if any of the following is possible;

- 1. Being able to transfer the credits to one of my other accounts; my office in downtown Moab, or my home in Moab. I talked to them about that, but they said NO.... I just can't do it. I don't understand why, that seems like a logical thing to me, and in the public interest. I am the one generating the electricity, why can't I use it. Again, is that their internal policy or one approved by the commission.
- 2. Having Rocky Mountain Power buy back the credits I have accumulated. That seems fair to me, and an incentive for me to use as little electricity off the grid, and to generate as much as possible.
- 3. Carrying over ones credits for a year after earning them, and not having them expire all on one date. I don't understand the March expiration of all?
