I am writing to express my concern about the possible rate discrepancy that may occur between net-metered and non-net-metered customers of Pacificorp. I'm not sure if you are the person to submit this concern to. If not, please let me know who I should contact. It sounds like right notine Public Service Commission has directed PacifiCorp to compare costs in order to possibly come up with new rates for net metered customers. I would hope that the Public Service Commission carefully examines those costs, and not ignore the long-term costs that PacifiCorp saves by having customers produce some of their own energy needs through roof-top solar This private generation prevents PacifiCorp from having to find new sources of distributed energy as the population of Utah grows. The savings from not having to develop new projects or sign long-term contracts with other generators would be a benefit to all customers, not junet-metered customers. This benefit is far from speculative. PacifiCorp likely has all sorts of long-term projections in order to anticipate future needs. It is not clear why this issue should be treated which the neergy efficiency measures. Finally the benefits to the community that come from roof-top solar efforts are tremendous. There are numerous jobs and economic benefits to this industry and, the reduction in pollution and emissions is a long-term good for all of us that should not be overlooked.

I want to urge the Public Service Commission to reject any rate increase for net-metered customers.

We are current owners of a 34 panel solar system. My biggest complaint against RMP is their billing system. They bill monthly but balance the books once a year .

By that I mean, if we use more power than we produce or have in reserve, they charge us for the overage (like in the summer months). On the other hand, they take away any extra power produced over a period of a year at the end of March. There is no incentive for us to try storing some power credit in the fall - we just get it taken away . Why not be fair and bill yearly if RMP is going to square up yearly. I sure could use the fall carryover to pay towards the high summer AC bills. Right now we just get April and May to store up some power credit. By the way, I understand that the excess power taken away from us in March is being used to of fset RMP's nonpaying customers.

Hello, I would like to submit comment pertaining to the Rocky Mountain Power petition for impact to solar users.

Rocky Mountain Power is asserting the infrastructure cost is unfairly being funded by traditional customers not using solar due to solar users receiving credit for generating power and in turn lower power bills, which the petition appears to target new customers for additional fees who want to implement solar post Dec 2016 and change the credit rate when solar over-production gets shared to the grid.

- 1) Solar is already a very costly investment with 15+ yrs payback period using current credit rates. The technology of cells and deterioration of cells with age drives replacement at or not far from this payback period. The proposed changes will not only extend the payback period well past 20 yrs, it will deter consumers from implementing environmentally helpful technologies due to entry cost plus the lack of payback.
- 2) Rocky Mountain Power asserts the following:
 - a. They claim net metering customers underpay to cover the infrastructure costs by \$400 annually. My system saves me approximately \$1000 annually so they are stating 40% is infrastructure maintenance. Wow, that's a pretty high figure. Would be nice to know what this infrastructure cost is as I never see the power company in the 5 yrs I've been in my home. They also claim they provide the same level of customer support to net metering and traditional customers. Funny, I don't know what customer service they've provided as I haven't spoken to anyone or had face to face contact for 5 yrs in my home so what value is this service they speak of.
 - b. They claim to require a \$15 fixed charge for customer service and meters. Odd, I recall paying extra for my net meter when it was installed. Gotta wonder what the \$15 is really for.
 - c. They propose a reduction in net metering credit from existing levels of 8.85-14.5 cents per kwh to 3.81 cents per kwh. This is a 57-74% reduction in net credit per kwh. This is a pretty big pill to swallow and also difficult to believe loss of revenue to this extent and infrastructure need.
 - d. The comparable bill they propose pre and post net metering rate change is \$55 current to \$74 proposed which is a 35% increase. They claim traditional user would be \$114/mo.
 - i. In rebuttal to this, I would like to note they are attacking a single technology (solar). They have completely overlooked the revenue impact for other technologies like bulbs. Simply changing from incandescent to CFL results in 75% savings and changing to LED's is 90% savings relative to incandescent. So they are holding solar hostage simply because they have control of the metering and want a 35% increase due to lost revenue yet the hardware within a home has a much bigger impact. Why not go after homes which have LED's as they are not paying as big of bills either and in a much more significant way . Or what if someone opts to go with candles, what then. Have to ask why stop at solar if going to blame technology for causing revenue reduction.
 - 1. The post service didn't get higher rates due to emails, they had to adjust their model and adapt

- 2. I have solar hot water yet the gas company isn't chasing after me since I am using less gas due to solar assist
- 3. I've wanted to install wind power, would they then go after that and tax based on average wind speed in the area?
- 4. What about home wall insulation or sun tunnels so a user doesn't have to power excessive lights or heating/AC systems. Will they tax a user if their insulation R value is above a certain number since they'd be taking away revenue?
- 5. What about someone who has off grid system with ability to switch over? They wouldn't have net metering yet still have a traditional meter. Tax the batteries?
- 6. Where does it stop?

Technology and living in general is changing yet RMP does not want to adapt their model for what is driving the future. Those residences and businesses trying to do good and reduce pollution and use "free" energy are being punished. If this proposal by RMP goes through it will be another mark for politics and big business making claim they do not have the best interest of the society in mind. The sun and wind is free yet the monopolistic energy groups are taxing. Please help prevent taxing on free energy sources, particularly when the cost to implement these technologies is already very costly.

Rocky Mountain Power is requesting a rate increase that will drastically increase monthly energy cost for those with rooftop solar installations. I have three topics to consider: 1) They claim net meter customer are not paying share for grid maintenance. That is somewhat of a spurious argument in that net meter customer pay about a 9\$ fee every month for the access to the grid. While that may not be much, what may need to be considered, is I have been a grid customer for 35 plus years. In that time have never had to have RMP ever provide repairs of any kind to my home. Lets see 35 years X \$9 per month is over \$3700. Where did that money go if they have never been to my home, obviously somewhere else. 2) RMP is currently advertising they have one solar panel already operating for every man, woman and child in Utah. That is all well and good, but if I have my own solar panels that means they can't charge me for the solar power RMP generates which has very small impact on their profits. I see the new rate request as an control to maintain their monopoly on power generation. 3) I signed a contract to have solar panels installed on my home in October 2016, currently I am waiting fo the county permits for the install to be completed. RMP wants their rate increase to be extive Nov 22, the date of your meeting, in **fe**ct penalizing those of us opting for roof top when we haven't even finished out process. Additionally the rate structure they are requesting would essentially make it impossible for a rooftop net metering customer to ever recoup the expense of the installation. Again one more way RMP is wanting to force us to be continually in debt to their system. It is only fair that net metering customers some fee for grin maintenance/access, but not at the expense of ever recouping the expense for their systems, contribution to renewable energy generation and reduced environmental impact. Request (Closed): Dear Governor Herbert, As a Utah residents and homeowners with an installed photovoltaic solar array, we are writing to urge you go on record opposing PacificCorp's request to cancel immediately net-metering and to require new PV customers to a pay according to a prohibitively high rate. We also urge you to work with the Utah legislature to modify the Utah statutes that set rules for the PSC cost/benefit analysis so it takes into proper account external economies. 1. The company has chosen an expedited path to setting new rates without going through the more conventional public comment period including expert testimony. The issues here are too important and controversial to allow such an end run. On this ground alone, the request for expedited review and approval should be denied, 2. The company's avoided-cost calculations are based on expensive proprietery software models that are not available for public scrutiny and critique. The calculations must be reviewed by an independent body of experts. At the very least, the PSC should put off a decision until such an independent review can be made. 3. I strongly suspect that external economies have not been included in the cost/benefit accounting, but they must be, even if based only on well-founded estimates. Burning of fossil fuels degrades our air quality, and it is wreaking havoc around the world on wildlife, plants, and humans. *Not to include these external costs is fraudulent accounting*. We list some more external economic costs in 4 and 5 below. 4. The proposed change would make it too expensive to justify new installations. It would effectively shut down Utah's rapidly growing solar industry, resulting in the loss of several thousand Utah jobs. One has only to look at what happened to Nevada's solar industry when net metering was attacked there. 5. A warming climate is already hurting Utah's winter sports industry and will very likely kill it in the coming decades if we don't break world dependence on fossil fuels. The impact on Utah's economy will be devastating. Of all places, Utah should take the lead in this transformation of energy production. 6. We understand that our own net metering plan will be unaffected by the proposed change, but changing the rate structure for new customers as proposed is likely to set a precedent that will encourage PacificCorp to come after existing customers in the near future. "Divide and conquer" is a nefarious tactic. 7. Although this proposal is framed as a way to make the rate structure fairer to non-solar customers, I assert that the real driver of this proposal is that PacificCorp's profits are tied to power sales, and with reduced sales, company profits are decreasing. The whole industry has taken a position opposing residential solar power generation. This proposal is consistent with that position. 8. Home-generated solar power is a disruptive technology that is creating drastic changes in the power industry. The correct regulatory response to dealing with disruptive change is a disinterested and complete analysis of costs and benefits, coupled with an informed revision of regulatory legislation. The industry response should be not to stifle innovation, but to play along with it -- for example, by improving load balancing by replacing burners in coal-fired plants with new high-efficiency energy-storage technology and by modernizing our dangerously antiquated power grid. We would support rate changes that provide for a reduction in fossil-fuel burning. Thank you for considering our remarks. Sincerely, Carleton DeTar Laurel Casjens
