2	PROCEEDINGS
3	
4	THE HEARING OFFICER: All right. We'll go
5	ahead and go on the record.
6	Good morning. This is the time and place
7	noticed for Commission consideration of the
8	application of Rocky Mountain Power for approval of
9	the Power Purchase Agreement between PacifiCorp and
10	Tesoro Refining & Marketing Company in Docket
11	14-035-145.
12	My name is Jordan White, I'll be acting as
13	presiding officer for this hearing.
14	Let's go ahead and take appearances and
15	start with Mr. Olson.
16	MR. OLSON: Rex Olson on behalf of the
17	Office of Consumer Services.
18	MR. JETTER: And Justin Jetter
19	representing the Utah Division of Public Utilities.
20	And with me at counsel table is Charles Peterson,
21	technical consultant for the Division of Public
22	Utilities.
23	MR. SOLANDER: Good morning.
24	Daniel Solander on behalf of Rocky Mountain Power. I
25	have with me at counsel table Paul Clements, director

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1	of marketing and origination of PacifiCorp.
2	THE HEARING OFFICER: All right. Before
3	we proceed, just as a reminder, with respect to the
4	Division's memorandum, or actually request for
5	response that was filed on January 14, there is some
6	information that's been redacted as confidential. So
7	just to the extent that there's information that folks
8	have a claim or believe there's a claim for
9	confidentiality, just please give us a heads up so
10	that the court reporter can properly mark the record
11	and then we can clear folks from the hearing room who
12	have not signed an NDA or who are not otherwise
13	entitled to hear or see information pursuant to a
14	statutory redaction.
15	Okay. Mr. Solander, this is Rocky
16	Mountain Power's application, so I'll go ahead and let
17	you proceed.
18	MR. SOLANDER: Thank you.
19	Rocky Mountain Power would like to call
20	Paul Clements as its witness for the application.
21	THE HEARING OFFICER: Raise your right
22	hand.
23	Do you solemnly swear that the testimony
24	you are about to give is the whole truth and nothing
25	but the truth?

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1	THE WITNESS: Yes.
1 2	
	THE HEARING OFFICER: Thank you.
3	PAUL CLEMENTS,
4	called as a witness for and on behalf of Rocky
5	Mountain Power, being first duly sworn, was examined
6	and testified as follows:
7	DIRECT EXAMINATION
8	BY MR. SOLANDER:
9	Q. Could you please state your name and
10	business address for the record.
11	A. Yes.
12	My name is Paul Clements, C-L-E-M-E-N-T-S,
13	and I am at 201 South Main Street, Suite 2300, Salt
14	Lake City, Utah, 84010.
15	Q. And by whom are you employed and in what
16	capacity?
17	A. I'm employed by PacifiCorp, and I'll make
18	a slight correction to my title. While I appreciate
19	the promotion, I'm a senior power marketer for
20	PacifiCorp Energy.
21	Q. And as part of your duties as senior power
22	marketer, were you responsible for the negotiation of
23	the nonfirm power purchase agreement between Tesoro
24	and PacifiCorp?
25	A. Yes.

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1	Q. Can you please describe the agreement and
2	the negotiation of the agreement and the agreement
3	itself?
4	A. Yes.
5	A very brief summary of the agreement
6	
	and none of the information in my summary is
7	considered confidential.
8	I appreciate this opportunity to present
9	today before the Commission and request approval of
10	the qualifying facility Power Purchase Agreement
11	between Tesoro Refining & Marketing Company and
12	PacifiCorp.
13	The agreement provides for sale to
14	PacifiCorp of energy to be generated by Tesoro up to
15	25 megawatts from their gas-fired cogeneration
16	facility, which is owned by Tesoro and located in Salt
17	Lake City, Utah. This agreement is for a term that
18	goes through December 31, 2015. The parties currently
19	have in place a short-term bridging power purchase
20	agreement, which is not a QF agreement but an
21	agreement that the parties entered into that is
22	covering deliveries from the facility until this
23	agreement which is before the Commission today is
24	approved and effective, at which time the short-term
25	power purchase agreement will terminate and be

1	replaced with this agreement before the Commission
	replaced with this agreement before the Commission.
2	The purchase prices set forth in this
3	agreement were calculated using the methodology
4	approved by the Commission in Docket No. 03-035-14.
5	On January 14, 2015, the Division of Public Utilities
6	filed their report in which they recommended the
7	Commission approve the agreement.
8	To my knowledge, no other party has filed
9	comments on the Company's application. The Company
10	represents this agreement is compliant with relevant
11	Commission orders and with Utah Schedule No. 38. And
12	therefore, the Company requests the Commission approve
13	the agreement.
14	Q. Does that conclude your summary?
15	A. Yes, it does.
16	MR. SOLANDER: Mr. Clements is available
17	for questions from the Commission or from other
18	parties.
19	MR. JETTER: No questions from the
20	Division.
21	MR. OLSON: No questions.
22	THE HEARING OFFICER: Do you
23	MR. SOLANDER: I was just going to say, we
24	would ask that the agreements entered into on the 14th
25	of November and the Company's application both be

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1	entered into the record as evidence.
2	THE HEARING OFFICER: Any objection?
3	MR. OLSON: No objections.
4	THE HEARING OFFICER: They're received.
5	(The agreements entered into on the 14th
6	of November and the Company's application were
7	received into evidence.)
8	THE HEARING OFFICER: One question, I
9	guess, and I don't mean to jump ahead here, but I'm
10	assuming since you're going to bridge you're going
11	to request a bench ruling today?
12	MR. SOLANDER: That would be our intent,
13	yeah.
14	THE HEARING OFFICER: And so the requested
15	effective date, I guess if it is granted, would be
16	today, then.
17	Is that the requested effective date?
18	THE WITNESS: Yes, that would be correct.
19	THE HEARING OFFICER: Okay. All right.
20	Mr. Jetter?
21	MR. JETTER: Thank you, Your Honor.
22	The Division would like to have sworn in
23	Charles Peterson.
24	THE HEARING OFFICER: Do you solemnly
25	swear that the testimony you are about to give is the

1	whole truth and nothing but the truth?
2	THE WITNESS: Yes.
3	CHARLES PETERSON,
4	called as a witness for and on behalf of the Division
5	of Public Utilities, being first duly sworn, was
6	examined and testified as follows:
7	DIRECT EXAMINATION
8	BY MR. JETTER:
9	Q. Mr. Peterson, would you please state your
10	name and occupation for the record.
11	A. Charles E. Peterson, I'm a technical
12	consultant with the Division of Public Utilities, and
13	our address is 160 East 300 South in Salt Lake City.
14	Q. Thank you.
15	And have you had an opportunity to review
16	the application and exhibits attached to that
17	application filed by Rocky Mountain Power in this
18	docket?
19	A. Yes, I have.
20	Q. And did you prepare a memorandum filed by
21	the Division of Public Utilities, dated January 14,
22	2015?
23	A. Yes.
24	Q. And does that document continue to reflect
25	the position of the Division of Public Utilities?

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1	A. Yes.
2	Q. Are there any edits or changes that you
3	would like to make at this time?
4	A. Yes, one small edit on page 5.
5	I incorrectly designated Michelle Beck and
6	Cheryl Murray as being with the committee of consumer
7	services. That's an obsolete designation, they are
8	not at the Office of Consumer Services. Otherwise,
9	I'm unaware of any other corrections.
10	Q. Thank you.
11	The Division would like to move to enter
12	this document into the record.
13	THE HEARING OFFICER: Any objection?
14	MR. OLSON: No objection.
15	THE HEARING OFFICER: It's received.
16	(Memorandum filed by the Division of
17	Public Utilities, dated January 14, 2015, was received
18	into evidence.)
19	BY MR. JETTER:
20	Q. Thank you.
21	Are you aware of any opposition to
22	approval of this?
23	A. I'm not aware of any opposition.
24	Q. And do you believe that approval would be
25	just, reasonable, and in the public interest?

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1	A. Yes, I do.
2	Q. Thank you.
3	And I would just like to proffer, on
4	behalf of the Division, that we would support a bench
5	order, effective immediately, for this application.
6	Thank you. I have no further questions
7	for Mr. Peterson.
8	THE HEARING OFFICER: Did you have any
9	summary or are you available to cross-examine?
10	MR. JETTER: Yes, he's available for
11	cross.
12	MR. SOLANDER: No questions. Thank you.
13	MR. OLSON: No questions.
14	THE HEARING OFFICER: Mr. Olson?
15	MR. OLSON: The Office has reviewed the
16	application and would like to make no comment, so
17	THE HEARING OFFICER: No comment, okay.
18	Okay. Well, so we have a request for a
19	bench ruling.
20	Why don't we go ahead, then, and take a
21	was there something the other matters
22	MR. SOLANDER: I mean I would also
23	request, if possible, that the Commission follow up
24	the bench order with a written order by February 1,
25	which is the day that the interim agreement expires,

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1	just so that we can memorialize the bench order before
2	that will occur. I'm sorry, the end of February.
3	THE HEARING OFFICER: By the end of
4	February, okay. We'll definitely consider that into
5	your request.
6	Just a brief recess.
7	(A recess was taken.)
8	THE HEARING OFFICER: Let's go ahead and
9	go back on the record.
10	Appreciate the participation this morning.
11	Having considered PacifiCorp's
12	application, the comments filed in this docket by the
13	Division and the recommendation and from the lack of
14	opposition or silence from the Division, we infer
15	no opposition sorry, from the Office we infer no
16	opposition from the Office. The fact the opposition
17	is otherwise unopposed, the Commission finds the
18	approval of the application and the agreement
19	addressed therein as just and reasonable and in the
20	public interest and includes such approval relevant
21	statutes, rules, and Commission orders.
22	And therefore, the Commission approves the
23	application in Docket No. 14-035-145. This bench
24	order has been approved and confirmed by the
25	Commission and a written memorialization of this


1	decision will be filed. The effective approval date
2	for this agreement is today, which is January 22
3	21, 2015.
4	Before we adjourn today, are there any
5	other the effective date of this agreement is
6	January 22, 2015.
7	MR. EVANS: The effective date of the
8	approval?
9	THE HEARING OFFICER: The approval meaning
10	the
11	MR. EVANS: The Commission's order.
12	THE HEARING OFFICER: So just to be clear,
13	so, yes, the effective day of our approval is
14	effective date, wouldn't that coincide with the
15	effective date of the agreement?
16	MR. CLEMENT: Correct.
17	THE HEARING OFFICER: I just want to make
18	sure that you have what you need for we approve the
19	agreement effective today.
20	Is that
21	MR. SOLANDER: The 22nd.
22	THE HEARING OFFICER: The 22nd of January
23	2015.
24	Okay. Are there any other matters we need
25	to address before we adjourn?

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1	MR. JETTER: I don't think so.
2	THE HEARING OFFICER: Okay. We're
3	adjourned. Thank you.
