**Re: Advice No. 14-06
Tariff Schedule 118 – Low Income Weatherization**

Enclosed for filing are an original and five copies of proposed tariff sheets associated with Tariff P.S.C.U. No. 49 of PacifiCorp, d.b.a Rocky Mountain Power, applicable to electric service in the State of Utah. Pursuant to the requirement of Rule R746-405D, Rocky Mountain Power (the “Company”) states that the proposed tariff sheet does not constitute a violation of state law or Commission rule. The Company is requesting an effective date of August 1, 2014 for this change.

The purpose of this filing is to propose changes to Schedule 118, Low Income Weatherization. The changes do not alter the program and are housekeeping in nature. A summary is included below:

- References to the department in the State of Utah that administers the Low Income Weatherization services have been revised as their department name has changed to Utah Department of Work Force Services, Housing and Community Development Division (HCD). Revisions are incorporated on 118.1, 118.2 and 118.5.
- Financial assistance will be provided one time only on any individual measure, and up to two times per dwelling. The reference to “major or supplemental” measures is not necessary and is eliminated on 118.2.

- HCD forwards invoices to Rocky Mountain Power after they receive billing data from their subcontracting local weatherization agencies. This wording under Financial Assistance has been clarified on 118.3.
- Changes to adjust measure life to 20 years are proposed for window replacements, duct insulation and sealing, thermal doors and refrigerators. The change to window replacements, duct insulation/sealing and refrigerators align with the Home Energy Savings program measure life. The revision to thermal doors is based on the life assumed in Rocky Mountain Power's latest potential study. These revisions are incorporated on 118.3 and 118.4.
- The replacement window description has been revised to "Low E double pane replacement windows with U-value of .30 or lower". This matches the description that will be incorporated in HCD's guidelines and is included on 118.3.
- Reference to zonal thermostats has been deleted as HCD has not found this type of electric heating system in the homes they serve. This revision is made on 118.4.
- Addition of the Weatherization Assistance Program Technical Assistance Center database to determine the baseline usage of existing refrigerators is added. This is allowed by HCD and their federal funding sources (U.S. Department of Energy and Health and Human Services). This change is included on 118.4.
- Delete "Installation shall meet Federal, State and Local building codes". HCD monitors homes throughout the state and ensures building codes are followed. This language is removed from 118.5.
