Page 7 Yes, I have. 1 Α. 2 0. Could you please share that with the Commission? 3 Α. Sorry. I had had one thing here 4 Yes. 5 summarized so -- I present today for Commission approval a Qualifying Facility Power Purchase 6 7 Agreement between Kennecott Utah Power and 8 PacifiCorp. The Agreement provides for the sale to 9 PacifiCorp of energy to be generated by Kennecott up 10 to 31.8 megawatts, both between the refinery and the 11 smelter, from a waste heat fire cogeneration facility 12 constructed by Kennecott and located in Salt Lake City, Utah. 13 14 The Agreement is for a term of 12 months, 15 January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2016. purchase prices set forth in the Agreement were 16 17 calculated using the methodology approved by the Commission in Docket Number 03-035-14. 18 The Company filed a PPA for approval 19 20 September 25, 2015. In comments filed on November 3, 2015, the Division of Public Utilities recommended 21 2.2 that the Commission approve the contract as filed. 23 In addition, the Division recommended that the 24 Company continue to provide, at least quarterly, 25 hourly power purchase so that the Division can

Page 8 continue to monitor this contract. 1 2 The Agreement is compliant with relevant Commission orders and with Utah Schedule 38, and the 3 Company believes the PPA before the Commission for 4 5 approval does not have any issues raised by parties in this docket and recommends the Commission approve 6 the agreement. 8 Q. Does that conclude your summary of the 9 Refinery Agreement? 10 Α. Yes, it does. 11 Do you also have a summary of the smelter 0. 12 PPA? Yes, I do, and it is largely the same. 13 Α. 14 Would you like me to read it again? 15 0. I would represent to the Commission that the two contracts are largely the same. 16 What is the size of the contract for the 17 refinery as compared to the contract for the smelter? 18 19 Α. So the name plate capacity of the refinery 20 is 7.54 megawatts and the name plate capacity on the 21 smelter is 31.8 megawatts. 22 And in all other relevant portions of the 23 contract are they identical? 24 Α. Yes. 25 MR. SOLANDER: Okay. I would ask that --

So the Division had an opportunity to review the Power Purchase Agreement contracts between 16 Kennecott Utah Copper and PacifiCorp, and the 17 Division had a chance to review the calculations and 18 the grid model. And we 21 found that they correctly complied with Commission 2.2 orders on the method used to determine the pricing 23 for contracts under Schedule 38. 24 So, based on our review of the contracts, 25 we find that there are no issues, and we find them to
