Re: Reply Comments  
In the Matter of Rocky Mountain Power's Proposed Revisions to Electric Service  
Schedule No. 110, New Homes Program – Docket No. 15-035-T07

On May 15, 2015, the Public Service Commission of Utah (“Commission”) issued a Notice of Filing and Comment Period, allowing parties to file comments by June 1, 2015 and reply comments by June 8, 2015. The Division of Public Utilities (“DPU”), Office of Consumer Services (“OCS”), and Utah Clean Energy (“UCE”) filed comments on June 1, 2015. Rocky Mountain Power (“Company”) provides these reply comments in response to concerns raised in OCS’ comments.

OCS is concerned that despite the advantages of air source heat pump technology, the measure would result in load building and would also facilitate fuel switching. Although we understand OCS’ concerns, this measure is targeted for new homes being constructed where the decision to install an air source heat pump has already been made. If an air source heat pump is going to be installed, the Company wants to promote a more energy efficient air source heat pump to reduce electricity consumption.
