Dear Mr. Lively:

The Public Service Commission of Utah ("PSC") reviewed the September 8, 2017 filing by PacifiCorp, doing business as Rocky Mountain Power ("RMP"), proposing changes to Electric Service Schedule No. 111, Residential Energy Efficiency ("Schedule 111") and the Tariff Index. The proposed changes to Sheet Nos. B.1, 111.4, 111.5, and 111.7 remove expired offerings, introduce a new custom multi-family program ("MF Program"), and make minor administrative changes. The MF Program is designed to target hard to reach multi-family and low-income markets by enticing multi-family property owners to implement comprehensive energy efficiency retrofits.

The PSC also reviewed the September 28, 2017 action request response filed by the Division of Public Utilities ("DPU"). The DPU's response shows the MF Program should be cost-effective under the Utility Cost Test and the Participant Cost Test. RMP's filing shows the programs are not expected to be cost effective under the Total Resource Cost Test, the Total Resource Cost Test + Conservation Adder, nor the Ratepayer Impact Measure Test. Accordingly, the DPU will monitor the new program for cost-effectiveness and report on changes as necessary. The DPU recommends approval of the proposed changes to Schedule 111. No other comments were received.

Based on the PSC's review of RMP's filing and the DPU's recommendation, the proposed revisions to Index Sheet No. B.1 and Schedule 111 Sheet Nos. 111.4, 111.5, and 111.7 are approved as filed.
