TARIFF Rocky Mountain Power's Proposed Tariff Revisions to Electric Service Schedule No. 140, Non-Residential Energy Efficiency

On page 3 of PacifiCorp's February 8, 2019 Tariff filing PacifiCorp states one of the anticipated outcomes from this adjustment will be "[t]he same levels of cost-effectiveness as the prior incentive portfolio." On page 2 of the DPU's February 25, 2019 Action Request Response, the DPU states "[t]he Company's analysis show that cost-effectiveness, large customer participation and large customer average incentives will remain at basically the same levels."

Please provide analysis and support that cost-effectiveness of the portfolio, large customer participation, and large customer average incentives will remain at basically the same levels, with the approval of this tariff.
