RE: **Docket No. 20-035-34 – Notice of Intent to File a Proposed Charging Infrastructure Program with the Public Service Commission of Utah**

On March 28, 2020, pursuant to House Bill 396, Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure Amendments legislation was signed into law. Utah Code Annotated §54-4-41 authorizes a large-scale electric utility to seek approval from the Public Service Commission of Utah (“Commission”) to establish a program that allows for a maximum of \$50,000,000 in funding towards electric vehicle (“EV”) charging infrastructure. U.C.A. §54-4-41(3) requires that before the utility submits a proposed charging infrastructure program to the Commission for approval under U.C.A. §54-4-41(2), a large-scale electric utility shall seek and consider input from: (a) the Division of Public Utilities; (b) the Office of Consumer Services; (c) the Division of Air Quality; (d) the Department of Transportation; (e) the Governor’s Office of Economic Development; (f) the Office of Energy Development; (g) the board of the Utah Inland Port Authority; (h) representatives of the Point of the Mountain State Land Development Authority; (i) third-party electric vehicle battery charging service operators; and (j) any person that files a request for notice with the Commission.

The purpose of this letter is to notify the Commission and interested parties that Rocky Mountain Power (the “Company”) is in the early stages of developing a proposed charging infrastructure program, which it intends to submit for approval on or around December 31, 2020.

In accordance with §54-4-41(3), the Company will hold a stakeholder input meeting via conference call on September 24, 2020 at from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm to seek input for an EV charging infrastructure program. To comply with §54-4-41(3), the Company respectfully requests that the Commission issue a public notice at its earliest convenience to allow any additional persons to file a request for notice with the Commission of their desire to provide input on the Company’s proposed EV charging infrastructure program. This will allow the Company to extend the invitation to the stakeholder input meeting and/or seek input from those persons prior to submitting the EV infrastructure charging program for approval.
