Dear Mr. Parker:

The Public Service Commission of Utah (PSC) reviewed the Division of Public Utilities' (DPU) March 29, 2023 memorandum that summarizes the results of DPU's annual audit¹ of PacifiCorp's 2022 fuel inventory policies and practices.

DPU states PacifiCorp has formal policies and procedures for fuel procurement and inventory that were updated in 2023. DPU found that PacifiCorp had prudent business reasons for plants with inventory outside of the target and asserts that PacifiCorp has plans to align the inventory with the target as appropriate.

The PSC appreciates DPU's ongoing efforts to monitor and audit PacifiCorp's fuel inventory policies and practices and to identify coal inventory-related issues.
