Dear Commissioners,

Thank you for your continuing interest in the survival of our company. As you know, we have been pursuing a new contract on comparable terms to our existing service for the past fourteen months. Scottish Power has shown little interest in our predicament and has aggressively taken steps that will force us to close our doors in the near future.

We have been attempting to bring them to the negotiation table for over a year. Frustrated in our attempts to open substantive discussions, we are taking the first steps to putting the matter before the Public Service Commission. Scottish Power's various positions on this matter have caused such confusion that I have asked the nationally recognized energy expert, Robert McCullough, to review the cost and revenue issues for the Governor's office, key members of the legislature, and staff from the Commission and the Committee.

Mr. McCullough will discuss a number of important issues including the competitive position of MagCorp regionally and internationally, Scottish Power's cost structure, and the impacts on other rate payers.

Mr. Scott Muir, Consultant with Tooele County will address Tooele County's concerns about the economic development impacts of Scottish Power's plans. He estimates that the loss of MagCorp will eliminate over \$125,000,000 in economic benefits to the State of Utah. It also signals the risk to Utah's economic development in general as foreign corporate decision making takes precedence over Utah employment and economic development.

Your attendance and attention by yourself and/or key staff to this very important matter is greatly appreciated. Other key members of the legislature are being invited to attend and participate as well.
