On January 14, 2009 the Commission issued its Report and Order regarding the Formal Complaint of Dee Dillman and Marie Ginman. On February 24, 2009, more than 30 days after the issuance of the Report and Order, Rocky Mountain Power (Company) filed its Petition for Review and Reconsideration of Commission's Report and Order. The Company's Petition was strictly limited to review of the portion of the Order requiring the Company to offer a Residential Deferred Payment Agreement as defined in R746-200-5. Although the Company's Petition was filed after the 30-day period mandated by Utah Code §§ 63G-4-301 and 54-7-15, the Company did inform the Commission, verbally, on February 9, 2009, that it would file the limited Petition for Review and Reconsideration. Therefore, finding that the Company was not dilatory in filing its Petition, and finding good cause shown for lengthening the time in which the Company may file its Petition, pursuant to Utah Code § 63G-4-102(9), the Commission lengthens the time in which the Company may file its Petition. Additionally, based on the review of the pleading, the Commission concludes that it will grant reconsideration.
