PETITION FOR LEAVE TO INTERVENE

Pursuant to the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the Utah Public Service Commission (Commission), The Salt Lake Community Action Program, the Crossroads Urban Center and Utah Legislative Watch (Collectively known as the Utah Ratepayers Alliance) hereby petition for leave to intervene in the above-captioned docket and, in support thereof, state as follows:

1. The Salt Lake Community Action Program (CAP) is a private nonprofit communitybased organization that addresses the needs of low-income people through service delivery and advocacy.

2. Crossroads Urban Center (Crossroads) is a nonprofit community-based organization serving the needs of low-income people in the Salt Lake Metropolitan Area.

3. Utah Legislative Watch (ULW) is a nonprofit volunteer corporation established to address the interests of citizens of Utah as consumers and as taxpayers.

4. CAP, Crossroads and ULW have a special interest in ensuring that the people they represent are charged fair and reasonable gas rates. Any change in the tariffs of Questar Gas Company may have an impact on residential electric customers and the price that residential customers will have to pay.

5. Furthermore, since Salt Lake Community Action Program and Crossroads Urban Center represent low income people, those organizations have a particular interest in ensuring that natural gas utility rates remain as low as possible since people with limited incomes pay such a disproportionate share of their income for energy utilities.

6. Accordingly, CAP, Crossroads and ULW possess a direct and substantial interest in the subject matter of this case, and seek via this intervention petition to protect that interest as it may

appear. Participation in this docket will be in the public interest and may also be of particular assistance to the Commission in rendering informed decisions on the issues that will likely be raised.

7. Intervention by CAP, Crossroads and ULW will not delay the proceeding or unduly burden the other parties in the proceeding.
