Dear Mr. Mooy,

I am requesting, under the Utah Government Records Access and Management Act (GRAMA), unredacted copies of all formal complaints filed during the month of March 2008 against Questar Gas concerning company transponders that were underreporting natural gas usage by its consumers.

If you deny all or part of this request, I ask that you specify which exemption you believe covers each document or portion of a document withheld with sufficient particularity to enable me to seek administrative and, if necessary, judicial review of your determination. I also ask that you inform me of the administrative appeal process.

I request that you waive fees as this is information that is intended for use in a news article for publication and is in the public interest. If you decline the fee waiver, I ask that you contact me by telephone at (801) 257-8715 or via email at steve@sltrib.com so that I may consider the charge.

I ask that you handle my request for documents expeditiously so that we may pursue administrative and/or legal remedies, if necessary, to gain access to the information I am seeking. As you may know, the GRAMA statute provides for a five-day response period for the news media.
