3	JUDGE GOODWILL: This is the Public
4	Service Commission hearing in the matter of the
5	Pass-Through Application of Questar Gas Company for
6	an Adjustment in Rates and Charges for Natural Gas
7	Service in Utah, Public Service Commission docket
8	number 08-057-15.
9	Also in the matter of the Application of
10	Questar Gas Company to Amortize the Conservation
11	Enabling Tariff Balancing Account, Public Service
12	Commission docket number 08-057-16.
13	And finally, in the matter of the
14	Application of Questar Gas Company to Amortize the
15	Demand Side Management Deferred Account Balance,
16	Public Service Commission docket number 08-057-17.
17	I'm Steve Goodwill, the Administrative Law
18	Judge for the Public Service Commission. And I have
19	been assigned by the Commission to hear this matter.
20	Notice of this hearing on these three
21	dockets was issued by the Commission on the 24th of
22	June, 2008.
23	At this time we'll take appearances. And
24	we'll start with Questar.
25	MS. BELL: Colleen Larkin Bell, on behalf
26	

- of Questar Gas Company.
- 2 MS. SCHMID: Patricia E. Schmid, with the
- 3 Attorney General's Office, representing the Division
- 4 of Public Utilities.
- 5 MR. ORTON: Eric Orton, for the Committee
- 6 of Consumer Services.
- 7 I'm here without counsel.
- 8 ALJ GOODWILL: Thank you.
- 9 With that's, it's the Company's filing, so
- 10 we'll go ahead and turn to you, Ms. Bell.
- 11 MS. BELL: Yes. I would like to call Gary
- 12 L. Robinson as a witness for us.
- 13 ALJ GOODWILL: All right. Mr. Robinson,
- if you'll please stand and raise your right hand,
- 15 I'll go ahead and swear you in.
- 16 GARY L. ROBINSON,
- 17 called as a witness, being first duly sworn,
- 18 was examined and testified as follows:

20 ALJ GOODWILL: Thank you.

21

- 22 EXAMINATION
- 23 BY MS. BELL:
- Q. Mr. Robinson, will you please state your
- 25 full name for the record.

- 1 A. Gary Robinson.
- 2 Q. And by whom are you employed?
- 3 A. Questar Gar Company.
- 4 Q. And what is your title at Questar Gas
- 5 Company?
- 6 A. Director of Regulatory Affairs.
- 7 Q. And in that capacity, are you familiar
- 8 with the applications that been filed in docket
- 9 08-057-15, 08-057-16 and 08-057-17?
- 10 A. Yes. I am.
- 11 Q. And were they prepared by you or under
- 12 your direction?
- 13 A. Yes.
- Q. Would you please summarize for us the
- 15 first application, which is what we call the
- 16 pass-through application, and explain to us,
- 17 generally, what the increase amount was for and
- 18 explain the two phases that the Company proposed.
- 19 A. Sure. This is the -- the tariff --
- 20 Questar Gas tariff requires that the Company file at
- 21 least two pass-throughs each year. And this is the
- first pass-through in 2008.
- We are asking -- as we ran the numbers in
- this for the pass-through, we found total gas costs
- in Utah of \$909 million, which was an increase of

- 1 \$379 million. We -- in looking at the pass-through
- 2 and when it would go into effect, since these rates
- 3 will go into effect in the summer when volumes are
- 4 down and the costs of service gas is making up a
- 5 larger portion of the gas supply mix, what the
- 6 Company is recommending, instead of the entire \$379
- 7 million increase, to only increase about half. And
- 8 that is an increase of \$195 million. The effect of
- 9 that \$195 million increase is -- to the typical
- 10 customer, it's an increase of \$149.39. Or \$22.85.
- 11 Since the Company will be filing another
- 12 pass-through later in the year, the remaining portion
- of the increase, of the \$379 million increase, will
- 14 be made effective in the next pass-through that we
- 15 file in about October of this year.
- 16 O. Did the Division of Public Utilities file
- a memo in this docket regarding this pass-through
- 18 application?
- 19 A. Yes. They did.
- 20 O. And what was their recommendation?
- 21 A. I believe their recommendation was to do
- the \$195 million increase.
- Q. Turning now to the application to amortize
- the conservation enabling tariff, and I believe that
- was docket 08-057-16, would you provide a brief

- 1 summary of that request.
- 2 A. Well, in accordance with the order in
- docket number 05-057-T01, the Company is to file,
- 4 along with the pass-through filings, a filing to
- 5 amortize the balance in the CET account. And
- 6 08-057-16, this docket, is the application to
- 7 amortize the CET balance.
- 8 In this case, the balance in the account
- 9 has dropped from the -- from the filing that we made
- 10 last November. So this actually represents a
- 11 decrease in rates. Let's see. It's a decrease of
- 12 about four cents a decatherm.
- 13 Q. Do you have any changes to any of the
- 14 exhibits in this particular application you would
- 15 like to make?
- 16 A. Yes. The Division was very kind to point
- 17 out that we had made an error in one of our exhibits.
- 18 So I would like to make a correction.
- 19 I think these have been handed out.
- 20 But in Exhibit 1.2 of this filing, the
- 21 rates on lines 5 and 6, for the GSS rate class were
- 22 in error. So I have filed an Exhibit 1.2U, which
- 23 corrects those GSS rates.
- MS. BELL: Your Honor, we have premarked
- 25 that exhibit as Exhibit 1.2U. And I believe everyone

- 1 has a copy of that. And we would like to have that
- 2 admitted.
- 3 ALJ GOODWILL: Any objection?
- 4 MS. SCHMID: None.
- 5 ALJ GOODWILL: Okay. We'll go ahead and
- 6 admit it as Questar Exhibit 1.2U.
- 7 (QUESTAR EXHIBIT-1.2U IS ADMITTED.
- 8 THE WITNESS: Okay. And so the effect of
- 9 the CET amortization would be a decrease to a typical
- 10 customer of \$3.04, or a .46 percent decrease.
- 11 Q. (By Ms. Bell) Would you now turn to the
- 12 application to amortize the demand side management
- budget, and I believe that was docket 08-057-17, and
- would you also provide a summary of this request.
- 15 A. Okay. Again, in accordance with the order
- in docket number 05-057-T01, the Commission
- 17 authorized the Company to establish a deferred
- 18 expense account for those expenses related to demand
- 19 side management. And this -- in this case, the
- 20 balance in the -- in this deferred account is
- \$8,700,000.
- 22 And so this request is to amortize that
- \$8.7 million over the next 12 months.
- 24 This results in an increase of about seven
- 25 cents per decatherm.

- 1 The effect on a typical customer of this
- 2 change is an increase to the typical customer of
- 3 \$5.62, or about .86 percent.
- 4 Q. Have you prepared tariff sheets showing
- 5 how -- if all three of these applications were
- 6 approved today, what the tariff would look like?
- 7 And in addition, have you prepared an
- 8 analysis showing what the impact of all three of
- 9 these would be on a typical customer?
- 10 A. Yes. So I believe these have also been
- 11 handed out.
- 12 And Hearing Exhibit 1 is the tariff sheets
- for the GS-1 and the GSS rate schedules, which
- 14 include all -- the changes of all three filings. The
- 15 tariff sheets for all of the other rate schedules
- 16 will remain as filed in docket 08-057-15. So the
- only ones that change are the GS-1 and GSS rate
- 18 schedules.
- 19 And those have been handed out.
- 20 And then we also calculated the effect on
- 21 a typical customer of all three rate changes
- 22 combined. And that would result in an increase to
- 23 the typical customer \$151.94, which is a 23.24
- 24 percent increase.
- MS. BELL: Your Honor, we have premarked

- 1 the tariff sheets as Hearing Exhibit 1, for docket
- 2 numbers 08-057-15, 08-057-16 and 08-057-17.
- 3 And we've premarked the effect on GS-1
- 4 typical customers as Hearing Exhibit 2, for those
- 5 same three dockets.
- And I would like to have those admitted.
- 7 ALJ GOODWILL: Any objection to what's
- 8 been marked as Hearing Exhibit 1 or Hearing
- 9 Exhibit 2?
- MS. SCHMID: None.
- 11 ALJ GOODWILL: Okay. We'll go ahead and
- 12 admit those.
- 13 (QUESTAR EXHIBITS-1-AND-2 ARE ADMITTED.)
- Q. (By Ms. Bell) Does this conclude your
- 15 testimony with regard to these three applications,
- 16 Mr. Robinson?
- 17 A. Yes. It does.
- 18 MS. BELL: With that, Mr. Robinson is
- 19 available for questions.
- 20 ALJ GOODWILL: Ms. Schmid?
- MS. SCHMID: The Division has no
- 22 questions.
- 23 ALJ GOODWILL: Okay. Thank you, Mr.
- 24 Robinson.
- 25 Anything further, Ms. Bell?

1	MS. BELL: No. Nothing further.
2	ALJ GOODWILL: Okay. We'll turn to the
3	Division.
4	Ms. Schmid.
5	MS. SCHMID: Good morning.
6	The Division would like to call Marlin
7	Barrow as its witness.
8	Could Mr. Barrow please be sworn.
9	ALJ GOODWILL: Mr. Barrow, could you
10	please stand and raise your right hand. I'll go
11	ahead and swear you in.
12	MARLIN H. BARROW,
13	called as a witness, being first duly sworn,
14	was examined and testified as follows:
15	
16	ALJ GOODWILL: Thank you.
17	Please be seated.
18	
19	EXAMINATION
20	BY MS. SCHMID:
21	Q. Good morning.
22	By whom are you employed and in what
23	capacity?
24	A. I'm employed by the Division of Public
25	Utilities as a technical consultant.

- 1 Q. In that capacity, have you worked on what
- 2 is known as docket number 08-057-15, a pass-through
- 3 account from Questar Gas?
- 4 A. Yes.
- 5 Q. Did you prepare and/or assist in preparing
- 6 a memorandum that the Division filed in that docket,
- 7 dated June 23rd, 2008?
- 8 A. Yes. I did.
- 9 Q. In your capacity as a Division employee,
- 10 did you participate in the analysis of docket
- 11 08-057-16, the conservation enabling tariff?
- 12 A. Yes. I did.
- 13 Q. And did you participate or assist in
- 14 participating in a memorandum, dated June 13, 2008,
- that the Division filed addressing that matter?
- 16 A. Yes.
- 17 Q. Also in your capacity as a Division
- 18 employee, did you participate in docket 08-057-17,
- 19 the DSM docket?
- 20 A. Yes. I did.
- 21 Q. And in your capacity, did you participate
- or assist in preparing a memorandum, dated June 13th,
- 23 2008 in that docket?
- 24 A. Yes.

MS. SCHMID: With that, the Division would

- 1 like to request admission of the Division's
- 2 memorandum, dated June 23rd, 2008. And I request
- 3 that be marked Exhibit DPU Exhibit 1.
- 4 And I apologize for not premarking that.
- 5 The Division would also like to request
- 6 admission of what it would like to call DPU Exhibit
- 7 2, a document dated June 13th, 2008, the Division's
- 8 memorandum addressing the CET tariff.
- 9 And finally, the Division's memorandum,
- dated June 13th, 2008, that I would request be marked
- 11 DPU Exhibit 3, addressing the DSM account balance
- 12 issue.
- 13 ALJ GOODWILL: Okay. We'll mark them as
- 14 such.
- 15 Is there any objection to the admission of
- 16 DPU Exhibits 1, 2 or 3?
- MS. BELL: No objection.
- 18 ALJ GOODWILL: Okay. We'll go ahead and
- 19 admit them.
- 20 (DPU EXHIBITS-1-THROUGH-3 ARE ADMITTED.)
- Q. (By Ms. Schmid) Mr. Barrow, do you have a
- 22 brief summary of these matters that you would like to
- 23 present today?
- 24 A. Yes. Very briefly.
- The Division reviewed all three

- 1 applications to make that sure they were complete and
- 2 to verify the numbers presented. We made that
- 3 initial review, and as stated in our memos, approved
- 4 the application as filed.
- 5 The Division, however, requested that the
- 6 rates be made interim in our memo. We are currently
- 7 in a process of auditing the entries in the account
- 8 for the CET balance, as well as the DSM amortization
- 9 request. And as soon as those numbers have been
- 10 completed, we will file a memo making the final
- 11 determination of what those rates should be.
- 12 With respect to the pass-through filing,
- 13 we did file that with an interim request. And as
- 14 always, the Division audits the 191 account.
- 15 However, we are currently in the process of reviewing
- 16 the year 2007. And therefore, as soon as that audit
- 17 is done, we will make a recommendation regarding the
- 18 previous applications effective to the 2007
- 19 pass-through filings.
- 20 The 2008 will -- audit will begin as soon
- as we finish the 2007 audit.
- 22 But the Division did review everything and
- does agree with the Company's filings that the rate
- 24 increase is on an annual basis. All three filings
- 25 together will increase a typical customer's -- who

- 1 uses about 80 decatherms a year, will increase their
- 2 annual bill \$151.94 for those that stay in the first
- 3 block. That's about a 23.24 percent increase from
- 4 current rates.
- 5 Q. Mr. Barrow, is it the Division's position
- 6 that with the rates changed as described herein today
- and in DPU Exhibits 1, 2 and 3, the resulting rates
- 8 will be just, reasonable and in the public interest?
- 9 A. In the public interest, that's a tough
- one. But unfortunately, we do find the rates are
- just and reasonable given the circumstances of
- 12 today's environment.
- 13 O. And just a clarification, is there
- 14 anything in the Division's memorandum that states
- that the resulting rates would not be in the public
- 16 interest?
- 17 A. No. There is nothing in there that states
- 18 it. That's just my personal opinion.
- 19 MS. SCHMID: Thank you very much.
- 20 Mr. Barrow is now available for
- 21 questioning.
- 22 ALJ GOODWILL: Ms. Bell, do you have any
- 23 questions?
- MS. BELL: No questions.
- 25 ALJ GOODWILL: Mr. Barrow, just a couple

- 1 real quick.
- 2 The Division's memorandum, that's now been
- 3 marked DPU Exhibit 2, regarding the CET application,
- 4 I know the Commission -- or I note the Division notes
- 5 at the bottom in a footnote that there is just a
- 6 slight difference in the average decrease -- the
- 7 decrease that the average customer would see. And
- 8 the Division calculates it between \$3.07, or a .47
- 9 percent decrease, while the Company calculates it as
- 10 \$3.04 decrease, or .46 percent.
- Just for the benefit of the record, could
- 12 you explain that and whether or not that slight
- 13 difference has any bearing on the proposed tariff
- sheets and so forth that the Company filed today.
- THE WITNESS: Well, per my calculation, I
- had it \$3.07, which I think was in the actual
- 17 application that they filed. I haven't had a chance
- 18 to review the correction that possibly Mr. Robinson
- 19 prepared this morning to see what that effect was. I
- 20 noticed he mentioned \$3.04. But I still had it
- 21 \$3.07. And I think that was what was in the actual
- 22 application.
- 23 And I think when you add the decrease of
- \$3.07 to the \$5.62 that you get with the DSM
- increase, plus the \$149.39 that you get with 191

- 1 pass-through filing, you do come up with a total
- 2 increase of \$151.94, which I believe Mr. Robinson
- 3 mentioned in his testimony, as being the total
- 4 increase.
- 5 ALJ GOODWILL: And does the Division
- 6 concur then with the GS-1 rates and the GSS rates as
- 7 provided in the Questar Gas Exhibit 1, that was
- 8 admitted here this morning?
- 9 THE WITNESS: With respect to the GS-1
- 10 rates, I do concur with those rates.
- I haven't had a chance to review the GSS
- 12 yet since I just saw that.
- 13 If you'd just give me a minute, I'll take
- 14 a quick look.
- 15 ALJ GOODWILL: Okay.
- 16 THE WITNESS: Yes. I agree with the total
- 17 rates that he has filed with GSS rates in his revised
- 18 tariff sheets.
- 19 ALJ GOODWILL: Okay. Thanks.
- 20 And then just one final clarification.
- 21 Back to your testimony with regard to the
- 22 public interest, it's my understanding that the
- 23 Division is only recommending that these rates be
- 24 approved on an interim basis at this time.
- Would it be fair to characterize your

- 1 position as you might have some personal heartburn
- 2 with the effect these rates might have on Utah rate
- 3 payers in general, the dollar amount increases that
- 4 they will see, but the Division -- the Division does
- 5 not or the Division believes that these rates are
- 6 within the public interest, as that term is normally
- 7 used within Commission proceedings?
- 8 THE WITNESS: Yes. That's true. In the
- 9 Division's memo, we did recommend that this first
- 10 pass-through -- or the first phase of this
- 11 pass-through be implemented right now, which is only
- 12 half of the total request. It's the Division's
- understand that in September, the Company will update
- their filing with new information regarding future
- 15 prices at that time and go ahead with the second
- 16 phase. Whether that second phase will be the actual
- 17 amount increase in this filing, we don't know that.
- 18 They have the opportunity to make an adjustment to
- 19 that second amount, whatever the current markets
- 20 indicate at that time.
- 21 But for the first phase, we do believe
- 22 that the first phase is in the public interest with
- 23 this modified increase. And that it is just and
- 24 reasonable.
- 25 ALJ GOODWILL: Okay. Thanks.

1	Anything further, Ms. Schmid?
2	MS. SCHMID: Nothing from the Division.
3	ALJ GOODWILL: Okay. Ms. Bell, I take it
4	the Company has no objection to the Division's
5	recommendation that these rates be adopted on an
6	interim basis?
7	MS. BELL: No objection.
8	ALJ GOODWILL: Okay. Anything further
9	from either party?
10	MS. SCHMID: Nothing.
11	MS. BELL: No.
12	ALJ GOODWILL: Okay. I know that the
13	Division has recommended and the Company has
14	requested that these rates, if approved, go into
15	effect on July 1st, which is tomorrow. So just to
16	try and give you a sense, I plan within before
17	noon, to get a proposed order to the Commission,
18	recommending approval on an interim basis. And I
19	would anticipate the Commission getting that out
20	today.
21	Okay. Thank you very much.
22	MS. BELL: Thank you.
23	MS. SCHMID: Thank you.
