Questar Gas Requests Rate Increase

SALT LAKE CITY — Questar Gas is requesting an increase in its Utah natural gas rates. If the request is approved by the Public Service Commission of Utah (PSC), the monthly bill for the typical residential customer will increase by about 30 cents beginning Dec. 1.

"Abundant natural gas supplies continue to hold down the price of natural gas," said Craig Wagstaff, executive vice president and COO of Questar Gas. "But costs associated with enhancing the safety and reliability of our high-pressure pipelines are up. Still, we're continuing to work hard to make sure our rates remain among the lowest in the country."

In addition to recovering costs related to system improvements, the request also includes an adjustment on the balancing account associated with the company's conservation programs. These types of rate filings are commonly included with the company's passthrough or gas-cost adjustments, which typically occur twice a year.

Wagstaff reminded Questar Gas customers that funds may be available to help income-eligible customers who are elderly or disabled pay their gas bills. Customers can dial 211 for information about utility-assistance programs such as HEAT (Home Energy Assistance Target), a federally funded utility-assistance program, and REACH (Residential Energy Assistance through Community Help), which is funded by donations from Questar customers, employees and shareholders.
