Re: Docket No. 14-057-25. In the Matter of Questar Gas Company's Report on DSM Expenditures and Decatherm (Dth) Savings to Date.

RECOMMENDATION (APPROVAL)

The Division of Public Utilities (Division) recommends the Public Service Commission of Utah (Commission) approve the increases in the Builder and Business programs because they are in the public interest. No further action on the rest of the 2015 Energy Efficiency (EE) Budget is required.

ISSUE

On November 23, 2015 Questar Gas Company (Questar) filed a report with the Commission indicating that expenditures for the 2015 ThermWise Builder Program reached a total of \$3.3 million or 96% of budgeted levels during September, 2015. Expenditures for the Builder Program are forecasted to reach \$4.9 million or 1142% of budget by year end. Additionally, expenditures for the 201 ThermWise Business Program reached a total of \$2.5 million or 93% of budgeted levels during September, 2015. Expenditures for the Business Program are forecasted



to reach \$3.9 million or 144% of budget by year end. Questar requested Commission approval of the higher program budget levels for the Builder and Business Programs. On November 24, 2015 the Commission issued an Action Request to the Division regarding this matter. This is the Division's response to the Action Request.

DISCUSSION

The Commission's Order in Docket 05-057-T01 dated January 16, 2007 states:

Questar shall report to the Commission when the amount spent for any program reaches ninety percent of the budgeted amount, with an estimate of the projected spending needed for the remainder of the year. To the extent the projected spending exceeds the original budgeted amount Questar must seek Commission approval for the higher projected level of spending.

Questar has complied with the Commission's Order and filed what appears to be a request to increase the 2015 ThermWise Builder Program Budget along with an estimate of projected spending. At the end of August, 2015, the ThermWise Builder Program's total expenditures were \$2.86 million or 83% of the total budget amount of \$3.43 million. By the end of September, the Builder Program's expenditures reached \$3.30 million or 96% of budget and are expected to end the year at \$4.89 million, 42% over budget. The higher than expected spending in the Builder Rebates program is due to higher participation particularly in the 95% efficient furnace rebate measure for both single and multi-family market segments.

Questar has also filed what appears to be a request to increase the 2015 ThermWise Business Program Budget along with an estimate of projected spending. At the end of August, 2015, the ThermWise Business Program's total expenditures were \$2.38 million or 88% of the total budget amount of \$2.69 million. By the end of September, the Business Program's expenditures reached \$2.52 million or 93% of budget and are expected to end the year at \$3.87 million, 44% over budget. The higher than expected spending in the Business Rebates program is due to higher participation in high efficiency boilers, boiler tune-ups, and infrared heaters.

Both the Builder and Business Programs will have higher than estimated customer rebate totals which will result in higher related Dth savings that budgeted. Higher customer participation rates

should also improve the overall Builder and Business program cost-effectiveness results. For the quarter ending June 30, 2015 the Builder and Business Total Resource Cost Effectiveness was 0.7 and 0.8 respectively.

The Company has provided an estimate of total 2015 EE expenditures for each ThermWise Program that shows a total of \$27.5 million or 96% of the total 2015 EE budget is expected to be spent. While the Builder and Business programs are forecasted to exceed the projected budget, other programs are lower than forecast with the total program projected to remain below the total amount budgeted.

CONCLUSION

Based on the increased participation in the ThermWise Builder program and ThermWise Business program, specifically the 95% efficient furnace and high efficiency hot water boilers, the Company anticipates the 2015 EE Budget to be 96% of the approved budget. The increases in the Builder and Business programs are in the public interest and should be approved. No further action on the rest of the 2015 Energy Efficiency Budget is required at this time.
