SCHMID: Based upon the company's representation that the only change is due to the tax 10 11 credit authorized this morning, the division has no 12 objection to the admission of the requested exhibits --13 PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: That are in --14 MS. SCHMID: -- and application. 15 PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: Thank you. 16 MS. CLARK: Thank you. 17 (By Ms. Clark) Mr. Summers, would you please Q. summarize the relief the company is seeking in this 18 docket? 19 20 In this pass-through docket, docket No. Α. Yes. 21 18-057-04, Dominion Energy respectfully asks the Utah 22 Public Service Commission for approval of \$483,842,106 23 in Utah gas cost coverage. This represents an overall decrease of \$82,770,000. The components of this 24 25 increase are, first, a decrease of \$83,812,000 in

1	Page 10 commodity costs and, second, an increase of \$1,043,000
2	in supplier non-gas costs.
3	This request does not change the existing
4	commodity amortization that was established in docket
5	17-057-20 last fall. The company is also requesting an
6	amortization of an of under collected SNG costs. The
7	SNG balance is slightly uncollected from expected levels
8	at the end of March by about \$8 million, which leads to
9	the debit amortization charges shown on Exhibit 1.6,
10	page 3.
11	The cost of purchased gas was developed using
12	the forecasted gas prices from both Tyra Energy Group
13	and Cambridge Energy Research Associates. If this
14	application is approved, just for the pass-through, a
15	typical Utah GS customer using 80 decatherms per year
16	would see a decrease of \$59.61, or total annual decrease
17	of about 8.51 percent.
18	Now, noting that there is a combined effect
19	with the tax docket from earlier today, if we include
20	that in a typical bill calculation, a typical customer
21	would see a decrease of about \$70.38, or about 9.90
22	percent.
23	These rates are just, reasonable and in the
24	public interest. Therefore, we request that these rates
25	that are proposed in the commodity and SNG rates be

1	Page 11 allowed to go into effect on June 1st, 2018. That
2	concludes my summary.
3	MS. CLARK: Mr. Summers excuse me.

6	PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: They are admitted.
7	MS. CLARK: Thank you.
8	Q. (By Ms. Clark) Mr. Hunt, please summarize the
9	relief that the company is requesting in this docket.
10	A. Yes. In docket No. 18-057-05, the application
11	for an adjustment to the daily transportation imbalance
12	charge, the company seeks to update the daily
13	transportation imbalance charge using the historical
14	data for the 12 months ended March 31, 2018. This
15	update is done pursuant to paragraph 4.J of the Utah
16	Public Service Commission order dated November 9, 2015,
17	in Docket 14-057-31.
18	Based on the most recent historical data, the
19	company is proposing to reduce the rate from 7.191 cents
20	to 7.645 cents per decatherm. The company is requesting
21	that these rates be made effective June 1, 2018. The
22	company believes that this rate decrease is fair and
23	reasonable to the customers and should be approved by
24	the commission. That concludes my comments.
25	MS. CLARK: Mr. Hunt's available for more

Page 14 1 questions. 2 PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: Ms. Schmid? And I have none. Thank you. 3 4 MS. CLARK: Thank you. The company has nothing further. 5 PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: Ms. Schmid. 6 MS. SCHMID: 18 19 0. Good afternoon. 20 Good afternoon. Α. Please state your full name, title, employer 21 0. 22 and business address for the record. 23 Α. My name is Douglas D. Wheelwright. I am a technical consultant with Division of Public Utilities. 24 25 My address is 160 East 300 South, Salt Lake City.

Page 15 In connection with your employment by the 1 0. 2 division, have you participated on behalf of the division in Dockets No. 18-057-04 and 18-057-05? 3 4 Α. Yes. Could you please briefly describe your 5 0. activities related to these dockets? 6 We reviewed the information provided by the 7 Α. company, held several meetings with the company as well, 8 9 and asked that they request to clarify the information 10 provided. 11 And did you prepare and cause to be filed a Q. 12 memorandum to the commission from the division dated May 13 21st, 2018, addressing the 18-057-04 and the 18-057-05 14 docket? 15 Α. Yes. 16 MS. SCHMID: We have -- as mentioned earlier, we have since learned that one of the charts should have 17 been marked confidential and was not. The division 18 intends to file a corrected version marked confidential 19 20 with the effective chart labeled confidential and a 21 redacted version. 2.2 Mr. Wheelwright will be relying upon the 23 memorandum that he has prepared and filed with the commission. However, the only thing that changes is the 24 25 addition of the commission's confidentiality header and

2	the charts. With that, I am not sure how to ask for the
3	admission of things we haven't submitted yet. So but
4	perhaps they could be administrative notice of them

6	PRESIDING OFFICER HAMMER: We can do that.
7	And, of course, we can rely on anything Mr. Wheelwright
8	provides today in his testimony.
9	MS. SCHMID: Thank you.
10	Q. (By Ms. Schmid) Mr. Wheelwright, do you have
11	a summary?
12	A. Yes, I do.
13	Q. Please proceed.
14	A. Thank you. Docket No. 18057-04, notice of 191
15	pass-through application asks for commission approval
16	for a decrease of \$83.8 million in commodity in the
17	commodity component, and a one million dollar increase
18	in the supplier non-gas component of the natural gas
19	rates, for a net decrease of \$82.8 million. The primary
20	reason for the decrease in the commodity cost is due to
21	a reduction in the forecast price of cost of service gas
22	provided by Wexpro, and a decrease in the forecast price
23	of market purchase gas.
24	The increase in supplier non-gas portion of
25	the rate is primarily due to increases in transportation

1	Page 17 and gathering costs. For the test year ending May 31st,
2	2019, it is anticipated that approximately 57 percent of
3	the total gas requirement will be satisfied from the
4	Wexpro cost of service gas production, and the remaining
5	43 percent purchased through existing and future
6	contracts along with spot market purchase transactions.
7	If this docket is approved, a typical GS
8	customer will see a decrease in their annual bill of
9	\$59.61, or a decrease of 8.51 percent. The division
10	recognizes the proposed rate be approved on an interim
11	basis until a full audit of the 191 account can be
12	completed.
13	In summary, the division believes that the
14	requested change is in the public interest and
15	recommends that a proposed rate change be approved on an
16	interim basis with an effective date of June 1st, 2018.
17	Q. And Mr. Wheelwright, earlier today we heard
18	testimony that the tax credit approved in a different
19	docket earlier this morning will result in a decrease of
20	\$70.30 annually. Or approximately 9.9 percent?
21	A. That's just to clarify, that's the combined
22	effect of the pass-through and the tax surcredit would
23	have that impact.
24	Q. And so with that, do you believe that the
25	decrease, as reflected in your memo, and then as

Page 18 supplemented by the information provided today, is just, 1 2 reasonable and in the public interest? 3 Α. Yes, I do. 4 MS. Please proceed. 20 Thank you. Docket No. 18-057-05, or the Α. 21 transportation imbalance charge, was established to 22 charge transportation customers for the supplier non-gas 23 services that are being used on the company's natural gas distribution system. The calculation of this rate 24 is based on the methodology that was approved in Docket 25

1	Page 19 No. 14-057-31 and is to be adjusted with each
2	pass-through filing and in the next general rate case.
3	The proposed changes represent a decrease from
4	7.919 cents per decatherm to 7.645 cents per decatherm
5	and is calculated based on the actual volumes of
6	transportation customers for the 12 months ending March
7	31st, 2018. This rate applies to transportation
8	customers that are taking service under the MTTS and FT1
9	rate schedules, and any amount collected under the rate
10	is credited to GS customers through the 191 account.
11	This rate does not impact all transportation
12	customers in the same way and applies only if the
13	customer's nominations are outside of the plus or minus
14	5 percent daily tolerance limit. Transportation
15	customers can minimize and possibly avoid this charge
16	through accurate daily gas nominations.
17	This imbalance charge has been in place since
18	February 2016, and it does appear that the nominations
19	for many customers have become more accurate since this
20	rate was imposed.
21	The division believes that the requested
22	changes are in the public interest, and recommends that
23	a proposed rate be approved on an interim basis until a
24	full audit of the 191 account can be completed. That
25	concludes my summary.
