Recommendation (Approve Tariff Sheets)

Dominion Energy Utah's (Gas Utility) revised Utah Tariff Sections 2.02, 2.03 and 2.04, 4.02, 5.02, 5.03, and 5.04 that were submitted to the Utah Public Service Commission (Commission) on November 5, 2018 accurately reflect the Commission's order.

Issue

In its Report and Order issued October 31, 2018, the Commission approved the proposed rates in Docket Nos. 18-057-13, 18-057-14 and 18-057-16 on an interim basis "pending the results of the DPU's audit." Additionally the rates requested in Docket Nos. 18-057-15 and 18-057-17 (Conservation Enabling Tariff and Low Income Assistance respectively) were approved. All of these interim and final rates are approved and have an effective date of November 1, 2018.

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Additionally the settlement stipulation in Docket No. 18-057-T04 was approved by the Commission on October 23, 2018 and ordered with the same effective date.

Discussion

In its effort to comply with the Commission's October 23 and 31, 2018 orders, on November 5, 2018 the Gas Utility filed its Combined Legislative and Proposed Tariff Sheets to include all of the orders. The Division has determined that the changes in those tariff sheets are in accordance with Commission order.

Conclusion

The Gas Utility's proposed language in its revised Utah Tariff Sections is accurate and satisfies the Commission's order. The Division recommends that the Commission approve the proposed tariff.
