2	OFFICER HAMMER: Good morning,
3	everyone. This is the time and place noticed for a
4	hearing in the Matter of the Application of Dominion
5	Energy Utah to Make Tariff Modifications Relating to
б	Transportation Service. That's Commission Docket
7	No. 18-057-T04. My name is Michael Hammer, and I'm
8	the Commission's designated presiding officer for
9	this hearing. Let's go ahead and take appearances,
10	please.
11	MS. CLARK: My name is
12	Jenniffer Clark. I'm counsel for Dominion Energy
13	Utah, and I have with me Kelly Mendenhall who will
14	serve as the Company's witness today. We've also
15	brought with us Abbey Thomas, and you'll recognize
16	her name from the prefiled testimony. She does not
17	intend to summarize it today, but is certainly
18	available to be sworn in and answer questions should
19	you have any. Thank you.
20	MR. JETTER: And I'm Justin Jetter
21	with the Utah Attorney General's Office. I'm here
22	today representing the Utah Division of Public
23	Utilities. With me at counsel table is Division
24	witness, Eric Orton, who I intend to call and he
25	will provide a brief summary of the Division's

Page 5 1 position on this stipulation. 2 MR. MECHAM: Steve Mecham 3 representing the American Natural Gas Council. 4 OFFICER HAMMER: Mr. Mecham, do you intend to call a witness today? 5 6 MR. MECHAM: I do not. 7 MR. DODGE: Good morning. 8 Gary Dodge on behalf of the Utah Association of Energy Users. Kevin Higgins, who filed testimony in 9 this matter, is here in the hearing room and is 10 prepared to testify if you have questions for him; 11 12 otherwise, we won't have him testify. 13 OFFICER HAMMER: All right. Thank 14 you, Mr. Dodge. With that, we'll begin. Are there 15 any other preliminary matters? 16 MS. CLARK: There are two preliminary The first is that paragraph 8 of the 17 matters. settlement stipulation calls for all prefiled 18 testimony and exhibits to be admitted, and I wanted 19 20 to call that to your attention and be sure that we 21 accomplish that today. 2.2 The second is, the stipulation has 23 attachments. One of the attachments is a clean version of the proposed tariff language, and there 24 25 is an erroneous date at the bottom of each of those

1	Page 6 tariff sheets. We inadvertently put the September 1
2	effective date, and I think we had requested a
3	November 1st in-service date. Mr. Mendenhall will
4	correct that on the record, but I wanted to bring
5	that to your attention as well.
6	OFFICER HAMMER: Thank you. So
7	should I interpret your remarks as a motion to
8	admit, based on the stipulation, all of the prefiled
9	exhibits and testimony?
10	MS. CLARK: Certainly.
11	OFFICER HAMMER: I take it there's no
12	objection? They're admitted. All right. With
13	that, Ms. Clark, please go ahead and call your first
14	witness.
15	MS. CLARK: The Company calls
16	Kelly B. Mendenhall.
17	KELLY B. MENDENHALL,
18	having been first duly sworn to tell the truth, was
19	examined and testified as follows:
20	BY MS. CLARK:
21	Q Please state your name and business
22	address for the record?
23	A My name is Kelly Mendenhall, and my
24	business address is 333 South State Street, Salt
25	Lake City, Utah.

Page 7 1 0 Can you identify your employer and your 2 title there? Yes. I'm the director of regulatory and 3 Α 4 pricing for Dominion Energy Utah. Are you prepared with a summary today of 5 0 the Company's position on the settlement stipulation 6 that's been filed? 7 8 Α I am. 9 0 Please proceed. Thank you. On August 1, 2018, Dominion 10 Α 11 Energy Utah proposed changes to the following 12 sections of its tariff: Section 3, Interruptible 13 Service, section 4, Interruptible Sales Service, and section 5, Transportation Service. The intent of 14 these changes was to provide additional 15 clarification for customers and to create a new hold 16 burn to scheduled quantity restriction, which would 17 give the Company another tool to enforce supply 18 analysis, as well as to provide customers with 19 20 greater flexibility to manage these imbalances. 21 On September 12, 2018, the Division of 2.2 Public Utilities, Utah Association of Energy Users, and American Natural Gas Council filed testimony in 23 24 this matter. Additional rebuttal testimony was 25 filed on September 26, 2018, by the Division and

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1	Page 8 ANGC. The parties have since come to agreement on
2	the provisions of the tariff, and the stipulation
3	was filed with the Commission yesterday.
4	And if I could briefly walk you through
5	the changes that were made. If you'll turn to
6	Exhibit C of the stipulation that was filed
7	yesterday. So Exhibit C is the redline legislative
8	version of the tariff, and just a couple of minor
9	changes. If you turn to page 3.2, you can see,
10	hopefully, highlighted in blue is some language, "in
11	its sole discretion." We agreed to remove that bit
12	of language. Then if you turn to page 3.3, Exhibit
13	C, there in the middle of the page, we added the
14	words, "each of," to clarify that the penalty
15	periods would be each three-year period. We just
16	wanted to clarify that a little bit.
17	And then if you turn to page 524, so this
18	is section 5.06, Customer Imbalance Management,
19	subpart 4. And this is where the substantive
20	changes were made, both in the initial filing with
21	the Company, as well as the stipulation. So just a
22	few things that were changed here, the original
23	proposal by the Company was that all volumes that
24	were outside of the scheduled, or scheduled amount
25	by each customer, would be charged a \$25 decatherm
1	

1	Page 9 penalty. The parties have agreed to change that
2	to it will be the first 10 percent outside of
3	that restriction will be charged \$5, and then
4	everything above 10 percent will be charged \$25.
5	In addition, we are allowing suppliers to
6	aggregate their volumes by geographic location, and
7	if you flip the page to 525, the different locations
8	are listed there on page 525. Going back to page
9	524, the Company had some overrun language in the
10	tariff. So basically, for example, if you had a
11	customer who had a contractual amount of 100 and
12	they used 101 decatherms, they would be charged 40
13	decatherms on that overrun of 1 decatherm. We have
14	agreed to eliminate that language from the proposal,
15	from the tariff. I believe that summarizes the
16	major substantive changes.
17	Oh, one other change, we agreed that on

18 days when we are asking customers to hold burn, or in other words, restrict their usage to the amount 19 20 of gas they have brought on the system that day, we 21 have agreed that if they bring more gas than we 22 need, we will waive the daily imbalance penalty that is normally applied during those times. So that's 23 the other substantive change on that page. 24 That 25 summarizes the major changes that the parties agreed

Page 10 1 to. 2 And I will also say we, on this tariff, 3 put September 1, 2018, as the effective date on all 4 the sheets, and those dates need to be changed to November 1, 2018. So the Company will make that 5 change and file updated tariff sheets to recognize 6 7 that change in date. And one more thing, the Company believes 8 9 that the proposed changes are just, reasonable, and in the public interest, and we ask that the 10 11 Commission approve the settlement stipulation with 12 the effective date of November 1st. That concludes 13 my summary. MS. CLARK: Mr. Mendenhall is 14 available for cross-examination and Commission 15 16 questions. 17 OFFICER HAMMER: Mr. Jetter? 18 MR. JETTER: I have no questions. 19 MR. MECHAM: Nor do I. 20 MR. DODGE: No questions. 21 OFFICER HAMMER: Thank you. And no 2.2 other witnesses, Ms. Clark? 23 MS. CLARK: No, thank you. 24 OFFICER HAMMER: Mr. Jetter? 25 MR. JETTER: The Division would like

Page 12 1 From the Division's position, this 2 stipulation represents an acceptable compromise; therefore, the Division recommends that the 3 4 Commission approve the stipulation, as it represents a fair and reasonable outcome and is in the public 5 interest. That's all I have. Thank you. 6 7 MR. JETTER: Thank you. I have no further questions. Mr. Orton is available for cross 8 9 or questions from the Commission. 10 OFFICER HAMMER: Any 11 cross-examination? 12 MS. CLARK: No, thank you. 13 MR. DODGE: No, thanks. 14 OFFICER HAMMER: Nothing else, 15 Mr. Jetter? 16 MR. JETTER: No, that's all. Thank 17 you. 18 OFFICER HAMMER: Mr. Mecham or 19 Mr. Dodge, do you have anything you want to say? 20 MR. MECHAM: I do not. 21 MR. DODGE: UAE supports the 2.2 stipulation, but beyond that, nothing. 23 OFFICER HAMMER: All right. Anything else before we adjourn, then? 24 25 MS. CLARK: No, thank you.
