CLARK: And I believe we have stipulated to the admission. But to the extent that we need to 15 16 move for the admission of the application, Mr. Stephenson's prefiled direct testimony and DEU 17 Exhibits 1.1 through 1.4, we would do so now. 18 19 HEARING OFFICER REIF: Any objection? 20 MS. SCHMID: No objection. 21 MR. MOORE: No objection. 2.2 HEARING OFFICER REIF: They are admitted. 23 MS. CLARK: Thank you. (By Ms. Clark) Mr. Stephenson, can you -- are 24 0. you familiar with the settlement stipulation that was 25

2	A. Yes.
3	
	Q. Can you summarize the company's position as it
4	relates to this docket and that settlement stipulation?
5	A. Yes, I can. In this docket the company seeks
6	to create a new service that would allow renewable
7	natural gas or RNG transporters to deliver RNG to their
8	customers as compressed natural gas fuel using Dominion
9	Energy's CNG refueling stations.
10	As this is a new concept for Dominion Energy
11	and its various stakeholders, the company worked
12	collaboratively with the Division of Public Utilities,
13	the Office of Consumer Services, as well as local
14	industry experts to ultimately land on a solution that
15	the company believes serves an emerging RNG market well,
16	supports various environmental and economic benefits,
17	and is in the public interest.
18	In the that effort, the Division of Public
19	Utilities, the Office of Consumer Services and the
20	company filed a settlement stipulation which revised the
21	company's original application.
22	The company's intent in its original filing
23	was to create a high level mechanism in the tariff that
24	would allow for special contracts to be approved on a
25	case-by-case basis, while the working details would be

1	included would be included within each special
2	contract.
3	Through discussions, the parties to the
4	settlement stipulation identified key details that could
5	be added to a new tariff section that would provide more
6	clarity and guidance outside of a special contract. The
7	parties encompassed these details in new tariff Section
8	5.07, renewable natural gas transportation service, or
9	RNGT for short.
10	And now I'd like to walk through some of the
11	key points excluded in this section. It was filed as
12	Exhibits A and B as legislative and proposed versions,
13	respectively. I have copy a copy of Exhibit A here,
14	and I'll just highlight some of the key provisions that
15	were included in the tariff.
16	So starting on page 5-18, which will be added
17	a new page to the tariff, we the parties agree to
18	include new definitions that at this point had not been
19	defined in our tariff. Those included renewable natural
20	gas, green attributes, receipt point and RNGT service.
21	Following there, midway down on page 518,
22	there is a section on applicability which defines that
23	this section is applicable to RNGT service. And then we
24	have an availability section which defines that the
25	service will be available for customers transporting RNG

Page 9 from a receipt point on the DEU system to a defined set 1 2 of company-owned NGB stations. 3 Following availability, we have an application 4 section which provides quidance to RNG transporters who wish to apply for this service. And this includes an 18 5 month window for projects, RNG transporters who have a 6 7 project under construction but would like to be able to begin using the stations to get their off-take in order 8 9 before the construction project is finished. So there's an 18 month window included in this paragraph. 10 11 The next section is a facility modification 12 section, which really parallels some of the language we 13 have regarding service with our other transportation customers but just outlines that if there are facility 14 modifications required to offer service to a particular 15 16 RNG transporter, then that upgrade necessary will be paid by the transporter to the company in advance of 17 service being offered. 18 19 The next section is regarding the required 20 contract, and this provides kind of the framework that 21 will be included within that contract. So each contract 22 that the company would bring forward to the commission 23 to approve on a case-by-case basis would include an 24 approved receipt point and daily contract limit, also 25 identification of alternate receipt points.

Page 10 And in addition, there's language regarding 1 2 indemnification, that RNG transporters will defend and 3 indemnify the company against claims and other 4 liabilities, as well as fees and charges that have been broken out into their own section. 5 So we have a fees and charges section, which 6 identifies the specific components of fees and charges 7 that the company will include in a special contract. 8 9 And that includes, No. 1, a cost-based administrative So now I am at the bottom of page 5-19, for those 10 fee. 11 following along. 12 A cost-based administrative fee, a 13 distribution nongas rate. Skipping ahead, a transportation imbalance charge, local charges and 14 15 applicable state sales taxes and then a fuel reimbursement of 1.5 percent which is consistent with 16 other transportation service customers on our tariff. 17 And then the last section is conditions of 18 19 service, which all have been repeated on each of our 20 transportation service schedules. And this is just 21 consistent with what other transportation customers are 22 required to adhere to. And that summarizes the proposed tariff section. 23 Mr. Stephenson, is it your testimony today 24 ο. that approval of the settlement stipulation that has 25

Page 11 1 been submitted with accompanying tariff sheets is just, 2 reasonable and in the public interest? 3 Α. Yes. 4 MS. CLARK: Mr. Stephenson is available for cross-examination and commission questions. 5 6 HEARING OFFICER REIF: Thank you. Any questions from the office? 7 8 MR. MOORE: No questions. 9 HEARING OFFICER REIF: Any questions from the division? 10 11 MS. SCHMID: No questions. 12 HEARING OFFICER REIF: Okay. Mr. Stephenson, 13 just a couple of questions for you please. I did hear 14 your testimony, and thank you for that. I just wanted to be sure that we're getting the right language, if it is a typo. 25

Page 12 On the first line right below required 1 2 contract, it says, "Each RNG transporter receiving RNGV," like Victor. I think that may be a typo. And it 3 4 may --5 THE WITNESS: Yeah. My copy has an RNGT, which is what we were -- it should be referred to in 6 7 here. 8 HEARING OFFICER REIF: Okay. 9 THE WITNESS: If we have an old version provided to the commission, we can update that. 10 11 HEARING OFFICER REIF: Okay. I am looking at 12 the copy that was filed on December 13th. And it's the 13 red-line copy. 14 THE WITNESS: Oh, okay. 15 HEARING OFFICER REIF: And so --16 THE WITNESS: And it may be that we updated our proposed copy and then didn't go back and update our 17 red line, but this should read RNGT. And I believe the 18 19 company will be happy to file an updated version of this 20 today. 21 HEARING OFFICER REIF: Okay. 2.2 THE WITNESS: To provide a corrected copy. 23 HEARING OFFICER REIF: Okay. I just wanted to confirm that the correction is noted. And then the 24 25 other thing that I wanted to ask you about, please, is

15	A. Yes, I have.
16	Q. Do you have testimony to offer today?
17	A. I have a summary of our position, yes.
18	Q. Please proceed.
19	A. Thank you. The division has reviewed the
20	original information as filed and has participated in
21	the settlement discussions with Dominion and the Office
22	of Consumer Services.
23	The division has not filed written testimony
24	in this docket but is in support of the changes to the
25	tariff that have been outlined in the stipulation and as

Page 15 they have been explained today. 1 2 It is the division's understanding that 3 customers that will be taking service under this portion 4 of the tariff will most likely require a special contract, which will include specific terms and 5 conditions. The proposed changes to the tariff will 6 help to clarify the general requirements for renewable 7 and natural gas transporters and will provide a 8 9 framework for how the billing components will be structured and included in a special contract. 10 11 The specific terms and conditions of any 12 future special contract related to renewable natural gas 13 transportation will be presented to the commission for review and approval. 14 15 The division supports the stipulation and the tariff changes and believes that the proposed changes 16 are in the public interest and are just and reasonable 17 in result. And that concludes my summary. 18 19 ο. Were you here when DEU proposed an effective 20 date of January 1st? 21 Α. Yes, I was. 22 ο. Can you tell us if the division supports that 23 proposed effective date? 24 The division would support that effective Α. 25 date, yes.

Page 16 1 0. Thank you very much. 2 MS. SCHMID: Mr. Wheelwright is now available 3 for questions, cross-examination and from the presiding 4 officer. HEARING OFFICER REIF: Thank you. Any 5 6 questions from the company? 7 MS. CLARK: No. The company has no questions. HEARING OFFICER REIF: Any questions from the 8 9 office? 10 MR. MOORE: No questions, thank you. 11 HEARING OFFICER REIF: Mr. Wheelwright, thank 12 you for your testimony this morning. Page 18 Yes, I do. 1 Α. 2 Q. Please proceed. 3 Α. The office was actively involved in all 4 stages, and I'd like to note that we especially appreciate the collaborative efforts that were involved 5 in this particular docket that we think led to good 6 7 results. I'd like to speak to just a few of the 8 specifics. First, we think it is appropriate and also 9 important to have the new Tariff 5.07 to clearly lay out 10 11 the primary terms, conditions and applicable rates. Ι 12 would note that it does require a contract to be 13 approved by the Public Service Commission. 14 And it also, we have a new service here, and 15 in some respects, it looks like TS service. And in other respects it looks like NGV service, and we think 16 that it appropriately ties to rates and conditions of --17 or some of the rates and conditions of the TS service, 18 19 and it also appropriately ties to some of the terms and 20 conditions of the NGV tariff. But yet it also allows 21 for certain limited variances within the contract, if 2.2 those are demonstrated to be in the public interest. 23 Also we note that the new changes to 7.07 24 provide good clarifications about how bio methane is 25 accepted into the Dominion system. So together, we
