
Application of Dominion Energy Utah for Approval of a Natural Gas Clean Air Project and Funding for the Intermountain Industrial Assessment Center	<u>DOCKET NO. 19-057-33</u>
	<u>ORDER</u>

ISSUED: August 23, 2022

BACKGROUND

On June 7, 2022, Dominion Energy Utah (DEU) filed the Annual Report on 2021 Sustainable Transportation and Energy Plan (“STEP Report”) with the Public Service Commission of Utah (PSC). The STEP Report was filed pursuant to the requirements in the PSC’s August 31, 2020 Order Approving Settlement Stipulation in Docket No. 19-057-33 (“Order”) and states that the annual report format will be agreed to by DEU, the Division of Public Utilities (DPU), and the Office of Consumer Services (OCS). The STEP Report summarizes potential energy efficiency and clean air benefits as a result of the program, University of Utah’s Intermountain Industrial Assessment Center STEP expenditures, estimated energy efficiency project payback periods, and businesses who participated in the assessments.

On July 7, 2022, DPU filed comments recommending the PSC acknowledge the STEP Report with recommendations. DPU’s recommendations request that DEU provide all the data and information used to create the tables and illustrations listed in the STEP Report in Excel format, and for an Excel exhibit containing the formulas used for calculating revenues generated by tariff surcharges, expenses, carrying charges, and the account balance. DPU states that the STEP Report complies with the Order on a high-level, but it needs the requested documents in order to conduct a more in-depth analysis.

On July 21, 2022, DEU filed reply comments in response to DPU's comments. DEU's reply comments summarize DPU's comments and agree with DPU's recommendations. DEU commits to including all the data and information used to create the tables and illustrations listed in the STEP Report in Excel format, and the Excel exhibits containing the formulas used for calculating revenues generated by tariff surcharges, expenses, carrying charges, and the account balance in future annual reports.

DISCUSSION, FINDINGS, AND CONCLUSIONS

The PSC finds that DEU's commitment to include DPU's requested documents in future annual reports complies with the Order section establishing that DEU, DPU, and OCS will agree upon the annual report format and its contents.

Based on those findings, the PSC's review of the STEP Report, DPU's comments and recommendation, DEU's reply comments, and the absence of any opposition, the PSC concludes that the STEP Report complies with the Order.

ORDER

We acknowledge the STEP Report and approve DEU's commitment to include the additional documents requested by DPU in future annual reports.

Notice of Opportunity for Agency Review or Rehearing

Pursuant to Utah Code Ann. §§ 63G-4-301 and 54-7-15, a party may seek agency review or rehearing of this order by filing a request for review or rehearing with the PSC within 30 days after the issuance of the order. Responses to a request for agency review or rehearing must be filed within 15 days of the filing of the request for review or rehearing. If the PSC fails to grant a request for review or rehearing within 30 days after the filing of a request for review or rehearing, it is deemed denied. Judicial review of the PSC's final agency action may be obtained by filing a Petition for Review with the Utah Supreme Court within 30 days after final agency action. Any Petition for Review must comply with the requirements of Utah Code Ann. §§ 63G-4-401, 63G-4-403, and the Utah Rules of Appellate Procedure.
