



Energy Efficiency Program Proposal

Low-Income Efficiency Program

Program Overview

Background

The Company proposes to continue funding the Low-Income Efficiency Program in 2020 at the level of \$500,000 (to be used for furnace replacements) and to disburse these funds in increments of \$250,000 every six months, with the first disbursement of these energy efficiency funds to occur in January and the second to occur in July. The Company also proposes to continue the simplified rebate application process for the Utah Department of Workforce Services and the Housing and Community Development Division (HCD). This process allows for rebates to be paid directly to the appropriate HCD. The complete program description, including qualifying HCD agencies, is listed in Section 2.15 of the Dominion Energy Utah Tariff (DEU Energy Efficiency Exhibit 1.9). The HCD agencies must comply with all other aspects of the Company's Tariff to qualify for ThermWise® rebates.

Projected Participants & Savings Measure Tool

Participation in the 2022 Low-Income Efficiency Program is projected to be 1,612 with a total annual savings of 20,369.
