The Commission has received a petition from AT&T, Sprint Nextel Corporation, T-Mobile West Corporation d/b/a T-Mobile, Qwest Corporation, Verizon Wireless and MCImetro Access Transmission Services, LLC d/b/a Verizon Access Transmission Services ("Carriers") requesting the Commission to consider using an area code overlay rather than an area code split for the upcoming exhaust of numbering resources in the 801 area code (which is expected to occur in the second quarter of 2009). In an April 26, 2000, decision made in Docket 99-999-05, the Commission decided that an area code split was to be used and designated the geographic areas which would continue to be served with the 801 area code and areas which would be served with a new 385 area code.

The Carriers argue that circumstances have changed substantially since the decision to use an area code split was made and propose that the Commission use an area code overlay instead. The Carriers maintain that:

- i. An overlay will not require consumers to change phone numbers
- ii. An overlay will be less confusing to consumers now and in the long term
- iii. There will be less Local Number Portability difficulties

iv. Easier and more effective customer awareness and education can be completed.
