By The Commission:

On May 24, 2012, Anderson Geneva, LLC filed a request for additional time to pursue settlement of this matter. Anderson Geneva reports it continues to conduct meaningful settlement discussions with both the Utah Transit Authority and Union Pacific Railroad regarding the crossing on which this controversy centers. Anderson Geneva requests on its own behalf, and on behalf of the other parties, an additional extension of time for 90 days to continue efforts to conclude this matter. Anderson Geneva agrees to provide to the Commission a report on the status of negotiations between the parties, together with any further requests for extension, at least every ninety (90) days.

The request for extended time to pursue settlement is granted. If a settlement has not been reached by September 15, 2012, Anderson Geneva shall file with the Commission, on or before that date, a further report of the status of negotiations.
