Re: Notice of Non-Competitive Procurement with Osmose Utilities Services, Inc.

## Commissioners:

In accordance with PacifiCorp's Procurement Policy, the Company must report to the Commission purchases of goods or services exceeding \$500,000 that are not competitively bid. This letter hereby serves as notice that, on December 1, 2015, PacifiCorp entered into a non-competitively bid amendment to a services contract with Osmose Utilities Services, Inc. ("Osmose"), which exceeds \$500,000. The contract amendment serves to extend the contract term for one year and has a projected cost of approximately \$9.4 million based on the pricing schedule.

Pursuant to PacifiCorp's Procurement Policy, a supplier may be awarded a contract on a non-competitive basis under certain circumstances, such as when competitive bidding is impossible or impractical, or when otherwise a non-competitive procurement has been demonstrated to be in the best interest of the Company. Accordingly, the contract amendment entered into by PacifiCorp with Osmose was justified. The extension of the existing services contract will ensure a continuity of service from Osmose, which provides pole test, treat, reinforce, and inspection services, until PacifiCorp can complete a competitive bid process for such services.
