and Union Telephone Company ("Members" or "URTA Members") hereby requests clarification

regarding the Notice of Investigation and Comment Period issued by the Utah Public Service

Commission (the "Commission") on October 9, 2018.

REQUEST FOR CLARIFICATION

On or about October 9, 2018, the Commission issued a Notice of Investigation and Comment Period ("Notice of Investigation") in which the Commission provided a brief history of the contribution method of the Utah Public Telecommunications Service Support Fund ("UUSF"). The Commission indicated that:

The Utah Legislature has expressed a preference that the PSC maintain a UUSF balance of at least three months of UUSF payments, and that the PSC not modify the UUSF contribution method more than once every three fiscal years.¹

The Commission cited to Senate Bill 4, Business, Economic Development, and Labor base Budget, 2018 General Session, Item 80, Lines 12-4-1220² as support for this "preference." The Commission indicated it has several dockets pending that could increase the UUSF distributions to an extent that could require a modification to the UUSF contribution method sooner than three fiscal years.³

URTA has reviewed SB 4. Lines 1204 through 1216 discuss a report that the Commission is to file by October 15, 2019 on certain performance measures for the UUSF. This is the language that the Commission relies on as an indication of the Legislature's preferences, or "targets" related to the UUSF. Specifically, the Commission is asked to report on:

(1) Number of months within a fiscal year during which the Fund did not maintain a balance equal to at least three months of fund payment (Target = 0); (2) Number of times a change to the **fund surcharge** occurred more than once every three fiscal years (Target = 0) . . . (emphasis added)

The language from Senate Bill 4 makes no reference to the surcharge <u>method</u>. The Commission's reference to contribution method in the Notice of Investigation does not mirror SB 4 which results in some confusion regarding the Notice of Investigation.

As the Commission is aware, SB 4 was passed in 2018, after the Commission had established the UUSF contribution method by rule. Therefore, at the time SB 4 was passed the Legislature was aware that the Commission elected a per access line/per connection surcharge

method for UUSF contribution. Review of SB 4 reveals that the Legislature wants the Commission to report on the number of times the amount of the surcharge is changed—not the number of times the <u>method</u> of collecting UUSF is changed. Therefore, URTA believes some clarification from the Commission on this issue would be helpful.

CONCLUSION

Because the language in the Notice of Investigation does not mirror the language in SB 4, URTA requests clarification from the Commission on whether the Commission is seeking comments on the amount of the UUSF contribution surcharge, and why it is or is not appropriate to modify the amount of the surcharge; or whether the Commission is seeking comments on the method of UUSF contribution. In other words, does the Commission want to revisit the method of contribution established by R746-8-301, or is the Commission seeking comments on the anticipated increases to the UUSF that would necessitate an increase to the amount of the UUSF contribution surcharge? Because the Comments are due by November 15, 2018, URTA respectfully requests that the Commission issue any clarification as soon as possible to assist parties in the finalization of their prepared Comments.
