AGREEMENT FILING

Pursuant to 47 U.S.C. § 252(e)(1), and Utah Code Ann. § 54-8b-2.2.(1)(d), Qwest Corporation ("Qwest") files the attached Qwest Local Services Platform Agreement entered into between Qwest and ionex Communications North, Inc. (fka Advanced Communications Group and Firstel, Inc.), for approval by the Public Service Commission of Utah. The attached Agreement shall be referred to herein as the "Commercial QLSP Agreement." As explained below, Qwest objects to being required to file the Commercial QLSP Agreement for approval and takes the position that the Commission lacks the authority to review, approve, amend, or reject the Commercial QLSP Agreement, in whole or in part. Qwest is therefore filing the attached Commercial QLSP Agreement under protest and with a reservation of rights as explained below.

I. BACKGROUND

Qwest's filing of the Commercial QLSP Agreement under protest is the result of the

Order entered by the Commission on September 30, 2004 in Docket No. 04-2245-01. In that

Order, the Commission denied Qwest's Motion to Dismiss the Agreement Filing of MCIMetro

Access Transmission Services, L.L.C. ("MCI"). In its Order, the Commission concluded that

the Commercial QPPTM Agreement between Qwest and MCI was subject to its jurisdiction and

that the law required that it be filed for approval by the Commission.

The Commercial QLSP Agreement filed by Qwest in this docket addresses the same

services as those in the Commercial QPPTM Agreement filed by MCI in Docket No. 04-2245-

01.

As the Commission is aware, on December 10, 2004, Qwest appealed the Commission's

decision to deny Qwest's motion in Docket No. 04-2245-01 to federal district court. Qwest

claims that the Commission's conclusions that (1) the Commercial QPPTM Agreement between

Qwest and MCI must be filed with the Commission and that (2) the Commission has the

authority to review, approve, or reject the Agreement, are unlawful. Owest has therefore sought

a declaratory ruling declaring the Commission's positions on those issues to be unlawful and for

injunctive relief to enforce the Court's decision. That case has been argued and a decision is

pending.
