Dear Julie:

Thank you for issuing the Public Service Commission's order in Docket 08-2427-01 canceling SBC LD's certificate. As you and I discussed, however, SBC LD only asked that they be allowed to discontinue providing business local exchange voice service in various exchanges, not that their certificate be canceled. The Commission and the Division of Public Utilities both acknowledged that SBC LD intends to continue providing business data services and intrastate long distance service in Utah. The Division's recommendation to the Commission dated February 26, 2008 states: "SBC LD will continue to provide tariffed business data services and also will continue to offer intrastate and interstate long distance services to Utah customers." On page 2 of the April 9, 2008 order the Commission states: "Applicant will continue to provide tariffed business data services to Utah customers. The Division concludes Applicant has complied with Commission Rule 746-350 requirements for discontinuing telecommunications service."

Unless the Commission intended that SBC LD be able to provide these services in the state without a certificate, I would request that the Commission issue an erratum order approving SBC LD's application to discontinue providing the services enumerated in its application and reinstating its certificate under which it will continue to provide business data services and intrastate long distance.
