3	JUDGE ARREDONDO: This is just a prehearing
4	conference in Docket No. 08-2469-01, and let's start
5	with Steve Mecham. Can you just state your appearance,
6	Steve.
7	MR. MECHAM: Yeah. Steve Mecham,
8	representing Utah Rural Telecom Association.
9	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Just go right down the
10	line.
11	MR. PROCTOR: Paul Proctor, representing the
12	Utah Office of Consumer Services. I'm accompanied by
13	Cheryl Murray, and Ms. Beck will be here shortly.
14	MR. GINSBERG: Michael Ginsberg for the
15	Division of Public Utilities and a variety of divisions
16	before you.
17	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Okay. And Mr. Guelker.
18	MR. GUELKER: Gary Guelker, All American
19	Telephone Company.
20	JUDGE ARREDONDO: And Mr. Evans.
21	MR. EVANS: Bill Evans of Parsons, Behle for
22	AT&T.
23	JUDGE ARREDONDO: And then George Baker
24	Thomson for Qwest and Roger Moffitt for AT&T, is that
25	right, did I hear you right?
	4

1	MR. BAKER THOMSON: That's correct, Your
2	Honor.
3	MR. MOFFITT: That's right.
4	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Okay. I just wanted to
5	take care of a couple of things before we started. Is
6	there anyone that hasn't seen the motion in limine that
7	was filed last week by All American? No. Okay.
8	And is there anyone that hasn't seen a copy
9	of the e-mail from Mr. Guelker asking that Mr is it
10	Goodale or Goodale?
11	MR. GUELKER: Goodale.
12	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Mr. Goodale. Is he still
13	wanting to appear by telephone?
14	MR. GUELKER: Let me explain that. When I
15	had spoke with him last Friday, Mr. Goodale indicated
16	he was having trouble getting to Salt Lake. He was
17	going to be flying in for the weekend. His flight was
18	cancelled because of some problems out East, the ripple
19	effect of those flights, and so he asked what
20	accommodations he could get to appear by phone.
21	Apparently, there's been some objections to
22	that, and so instead of causing an issue, I received an
23	e-mail from Mr. Goodale, indicating that he'll just do
24	what he has to do to try to get here in the face of
25	those objections, so I guess that's where we're at on
	5

1	that. It looks like he's going to be able to appear.
2	So just a request for an accommodation. Apparently,
3	folks weren't wanting to do that.
4	JUDGE ARREDONDO: So then that takes care of
5	that. The Commissioners did look at the motion in
6	limine. Does anybody want to respond to that here?
7	We'll give you until tomorrow if you want to file a
8	written response.
9	MR. GINSBERG: I can file a written response
10	tomorrow.
11	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Okay. Do you want to file
12	a written response tomorrow in addition? Do you want
13	to make any comments today on that?
14	MR. PROCTOR: Well, I was not prepared to
15	argue the motion today.
16	JUDGE ARREDONDO: You don't have to argue.
17	I'm just saying you can state anything you like today.
18	MR. PROCTOR: We prepared for this matter,
19	which begins on Wednesday morning. It would be
20	extraordinarily difficult for me to respond to that
21	motion in writing tomorrow.
22	I think it's utterly without merit. All
23	American cites in its motion the explanation,
24	certainly, that my client provided as to our concerns.
25	The Commission itself has said twice, once in the order
	6

1	you initially entered, and then on the order on
2	reconsideration, the Commission wants to hear evidence
3	about these things, let's have discovery so that we can
4	get that information. That's what we've been doing.
5	So to file a motion in limine at three or four o'clock
6	in the afternoon when the office is closed, by the way,
7	to strike all of the testimony that was directed
8	towards satisfying the Commission's interest, to me,
9	with all due respect, is disingenuous. It has no
10	merit. It should be denied.
11	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Okay. Anybody else want to
12	provide
13	MR. GINSBERG: I can provide comments too.
14	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Okay, go ahead.
15	MR. GINSBERG: The Division, I did not in any
16	way, in my mind, violate the discovery rules by you
17	saw the response that we gave, which said that we would
18	provide our position at the time it became available,
19	and pursuant to schedule, which meant when the
20	testimony was filed. Just like any other proceeding,
21	when the Division files a recommendation or testimony
22	or other types of positions, they're not there may
23	be discussions within the Division ahead of time, but
24	the final position is not completed until it's filed
25	with the Commission and gone through the Division's
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1	review.
2	It doesn't also, in my mind, appear that
3	there is any prejudice here. There's been no discovery
4	asked of the Division since it filed its testimony.
5	The only discovery that took place was the discovery
6	that was attached to the motion.
7	If there was a need for also, the schedule
8	was well established about when the testimony would be
9	filed. The schedule could have provided that parties
10	would have provided their position statements ahead of
11	time, but they did not. So I also don't think the
12	motion has any merit.
13	JUDGE ARREDONDO: All right. Anybody else
14	want to provide any comments? Anybody on the phone
15	want to provide any comments to the motion in limine?
16	MR. BAKER THOMSON: Your Honor, Qwest would
17	just note that if All American's truly surprised by the
18	position that the Division OCA are taking, then I'm
19	surprised in response to their surprise. It should be
20	no shock at all to All American that it would be
21	opposed by the Division on these matters.
22	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Okay. What I'm going to do
23	is anybody that would like to file a written response
24	to the motion has until tomorrow at four p.m. You can
25	do it via e-mail.
	o

1	MR. MECHAM: Also, in 2006, in the original
2	filing when they were asking for CPCN, the Division
3	filed a memo that was basically stating we were I
4	don't know if opposed is the exact word, but we were
5	uncomfortable with them getting a CPCN granted in the
6	Beehive exchange, which our testimony which we filed in
7	this case basically still supports that, which was on
8	file, and they had that memo in 2006. So if there was
9	some confusion of what our position was going to be, it
10	seems a little bit you know, it was already out
11	there three years ago.
12	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Okay. So, again, usually
13	we do require a hard copy response and an e-mail
14	response, but this time by four o'clock tomorrow if you
15	have a response to us via e-mail
16	MR. MECHAM: But there's no requirement to
17	file a response?
18	JUDGE ARREDONDO: You don't have to. And
19	I'll tell you right now I know the Commissioners are
20	inclined to deny the motion in limine. They will,
21	though, consider extending the hearing time. I know
22	we're all very busy, but they're willing to give you an
23	additional week or two.
24	MR. GUELKER: Okay, I'll consider that.
25	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Okay. Can you let me know
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1 by tomorrow? 2 MR. GUELKER: I will. JUDGE ARRENDO: By tomorrow by four? 3 4 MR. GUELKER: I will. 5 MR. PROCTOR: Your Honor, may I ask, in the 6 sense of extending the hearing time, you mean 7 postponing it a day and then --8 JUDGE ARREDONDO: Postpone it Wednesday and Thursday to the next week or the week after. 9 10 MR. GINSBERG: Could we know that as soon as -- that would be -- I mean, is that something you --11 12 MR. GUELKER: I don't know. I'd have to talk 13 with my client about that. 14 MR. GINSBERG: That's real important. JUDGE ARREDONDO: That's fine. But I just 15 16 need to know from them, and they need to respond, you 17 know. If you can -- actually, when can you know? MR. GUELKER: I should be able to know by the 18 end of the day. 19 20 JUDGE ARREDONDO: Okay. If you can let us 21 know --22 MR. GUELKER: He could be in the air right 23 I don't know what he's doing in terms of now. 24 traveling. I know he's trying to get here. 25 JUDGE ARREDONDO: Okay. So if you can let us 10

1	know, let's say, tomorrow by nine. Can you do that?
2	MR. GUELKER: Yeah. And then we can schedule
3	something and discuss dates, is that
4	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Yeah, that's fine, we'll do
5	that, yeah. I mean, that's why I brought my calendar
6	book here today. But I'll tell you right now their
7	first inclination is to hold the hearing Wednesday and
8	Thursday, barring some time and frankly, my
9	inclination, is just to move forward with this, as
10	opposed to delay it by just a week.
11	MR. GUELKER: Okay.
12	JUDGE ARREDONDO: So that's my inclination.
13	So I'll wait until tomorrow morning at nine and then
14	from there we'll proceed from that point. So the
15	hearing is set for this Wednesday and Thursday, nine
16	a.m. to five, six. We'll begin with All American. Who
17	do you plan to have on?
18	MR. GUELKER: David Goodale.
19	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Anybody else?
20	MR. GUELKER: No.
21	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Okay. And then what we'll
22	do after that, we'll go with the Division, and then the
23	Office. Division, who are your witnesses?
24	MR. GINSBERG: Just Casey Coleman.
25	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Okay. And the Office?

1	MR. PROCTOR: Michelle Beck, she filed the
2	prefiled testimony.
3	JUDGE ARREDONDO: What about at Qwest?
4	MR. BAKER THOMSON: Your Honor, we're going
5	to have Lisa Hensley as our sole witness.
6	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Okay. And AT&T?
7	MR. MOFFITT: Jack Hadiak as our sole
8	witness.
9	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Can you spell the last name
10	for me?
11	MR. MOFFITT: I think it's H-a-d-i-a-k. I'd
12	have to double check on that. Is that right, Bill?
13	MR. DUNCAN: That's right.
14	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Okay. And then UITA?
15	MR. DUNCAN: Douglas Merideth, in that order.
16	MR. MECHAM: Yeah, we'll probably go in that
17	order.
18	JUDGE ARREDONDO: My inclination is, you
19	know, we have our direct, cross, redirect, we might
20	allow another limited round for All American, DPU, and
21	OCS witnesses, but besides that in other words, if
22	you want to follow up with redirect or we'll go
23	with you know, I don't want to keep going back and
24	forth, but probably will be limited to All American,
25	DPS, and OCS.

1	MR. MECHAM: But if they have any kind of
2	responsive testimony to what was filed by Mr. Goodale's
3	earlier testimony, we could do that at that time.
4	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Yeah, that's typically what
5	we do.
6	Any evidence? Any evidentiary issues? I
7	mean, let me ask one question I have, there have
8	been some pleadings, I guess, orders from other
9	jurisdictions. Anybody know that they're going to
10	for example, I think there's an order submitted to us
11	from another jurisdiction in federal court that's like
12	a motion for summary judgment.
13	MR. PROCTOR: I have some discovery/
14	evidentiary issues, if that's what you're asking for.
15	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Yeah, bring them up right
16	now.
17	MR. GINSBERG: Because I have some too.
18	MR. PROCTOR: Go ahead, Mike, and start.
19	MR. GINSBERG: Well, I just want to make sure
20	that the Commission has taken, first, administrative
21	notice of the 06-2469-01 docket.
22	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Yes.
23	MR. GINSBERG: And the interconnection
24	docket, which is 07-05101-03.
25	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Yes.
	13

1	MR. GINSBERG: Okay. And then we would also
2	like to have included in the record, and we don't know
3	whether all of the reports that have been filed with
4	the Commission, that's the 2008 annual report, the
5	gross revenues report, USF report, and they have
б	recently submitted in discovery a 2007 annual report,
7	but we have no record that we've received it, so we'd
8	like to have some but we'd like, including the 2007
9	one that was provided in discovery, included in the
10	record.
11	We also have no internal record that that
12	report was filed, so if there's some it's also not
13	signed or dated. So I you know, that's something we
14	can address at the hearing or and we'd also like to
15	have included in the record all of the tariffs price
16	lists that have been filed. We asked discovery of all
17	the tariffs and price lists that exist, and there are,
18	as far as I can tell, three an FCC tariff number
19	one, dated July 1, 2005, FCC revised one, revised dated
20	6/17/08, and FCC two dated 4/27/08, and we'd like
21	and we can provide we have a CD that we put those on
22	because they're rather lengthy, and we'd like to have
23	those included in the record.
24	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Okay. Can you maybe
25	provide those? Have you provided those to Mr do

1 you have those? 2 MR. GINSBERG: Yeah, he provided them to us, 3 he provided them to us. 4 JUDGE ARREDONDO: Maybe you can work 5 together. 6 MR. GINSBERG: Yeah, right. I put them on a 7 CD because they're rather long, and I copied the front 8 pages so that we can provide that, but I don't --9 hopefully, no one wants a copy of them. 10 JUDGE ARREDONDO: If you're going to refer to 11 them --12 MR. GINSBERG: Yeah, I will refer to them. 13 JUDGE ARREDONDO: -- at least provide the 14 hard copies of the parts that are referred to. 15 MR. GINSBERG: Right, right. 16 JUDGE ARREDONDO: Okay. Any other --MR. GINSBERG: Well, we would like included 17 in the record the discovery that has been provided by 18 19 All American to the parties, which goes to the 20 operations out there. There's been discovery from the 21 Division, the Office, and Qwest. And he has provided 22 recently, I think the last day or two, in response to 23 the Commission's earlier motion, a verified statement 24 relating to all that discovery, and it was all done by 25 Mr. Goodale. And that's it for us right now.

JUDGE ARREDONDO: Okay. So if you want to 1 move for those at the beginning of the hearing, we'll 2 admit all that at the beginning, I think we'll let it 3 4 in. The Office? 5 6 MR. PROCTOR: Yeah. With respect to the 7 tariffs, we had requested from All American a copy of 8 their tariff of a particular date, and I'm trying to find it here. The response from All American was, 9 10 "Well, we provided that." But was that a reference to the particular data request under which they provided 11 12 it? And that's what I need. 13 MR. GUELKER: I'm not quite sure what you're 14 getting at. As I recall, I thought you had submitted some requests to us, and I'm just going by memory, 15 16 before we had produced the tariffs, and I assume you 17 were asking for the same tariffs that we hadn't produced before we provided our responses to discovery, 18 so I thought we'd already provided it. But if I 19 20 misunderstood that, then --21 **MR. PROCTOR:** I apologize here. I'm trying 22 to --23 MR. GINSBERG: I think the only response to 24 the tariffs that existed were the ones that you provided to us. 25

1	MR. GUELKER: Right.
2	MR. GINSBERG: There were like three or four
3	zip files attached. And as far as I can tell, the ones
4	that were in there were the three that I described.
5	MR. GUELKER: Those are the three we
6	produced.
7	MR. PROCTOR: It was in my third set of
8	requests, Request No. 8, "Provide a copy of All
9	American Telephone Company, Inc.'s Tariff FCC number 2,
10	April 21st, 2008."
11	And the response was, "All American states
12	that the tariff was previously produced in response to
13	previous data requests from the parties," but not a
14	reference to which one, so honestly, I had no idea
15	where it had been provided. And I went through my
16	records and I didn't find a record of it.
17	MR. GINSBERG: It was included in the
18	material I just listed
19	MR. PROCTOR: I know, but which
20	MR. GINSBERG: and it's on the CD.
21	MR. PROCTOR: Okay, so I'll have that one?
22	MR. GINSBERG: Yes.
23	MR. GUELKER: Yes.
24	MR. PROCTOR: All right. The other
25	JUDGE ARREDONDO: So you said it was April
	1'

1	27th. Is that the same one?						
2	MR. PROCTOR: April 21st, 2008.						
3	MR. GINSBERG: Oh, you know, I can't tell						
4	whether it's a one or a seven.						
5	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Okay, so it's probably						
6	April 21st.						
7	MR. GUELKER: We don't have two April 2008s.						
8	MR. GINSBERG: I have it right here, but I						
9	just can't it could be this could be a seven or						
10	it could be a one.						
11	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Okay. Well, just to be						
12	clear, there's not two?						
13	MR. GINSBERG: No.						
14	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Okay. So it's probably the						
15	21st?						
16	MR. PROCTOR: Yeah, it's 2008, FCC number 2.						
17	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Okay. So then that was						
18	MR. PROCTOR: Yeah. And then in we asked						
19	in our second set, request number 14, when was JEI, Joy						
20	Enterprises', Intelligent Voice Response System first						
21	installed in Garrison, Utah? And there was no response						
22	whatsoever to that data request. We need an answer to						
23	that one, and as soon as reasonably possible as well.						
24	MR. GUELKER: You know, I have that						
25	information, Paul, and we got that at the last minute.						
	18						

1	I'm wondering if I had somebody send it to you like						
2	I've entered it in, but I didn't I'll get you that						
3	information when I get back.						
4	MR. PROCTOR: I have none.						
5	MR. GUELKER: I'll give you that.						
б	MR. PROCTOR: And finally, as with the						
7	Division, the Office had requested in its third set the						
8	2007 annual report, and it was provided as an						
9	attachment to data requests. When I opened it,						
10	internal to that report it says, with respect to						
11	financial information, "See attached." There are no						
12	attachments to the annual report, so there's it						
13	provides really nothing. I need every attachment that						
14	the 2007 annual report refers to. And again, that						
15	would be very helpful if we could have that as soon as						
16	possible.						
17	And finally I'm not certain if this is the						
18	appropriate time to bring this up, but I will, just so						
19	that everyone knows of the concern. In rebuttal						
20	testimony, Mr. Goodale is it Goodale, Goodale?						
21	MR. GUELKER: It's produced Goodale.						
22	MR. PROCTOR: Goodale, all right, okay.						
23	Thank you. He referred to information that he						
24	received, advice he received, and counsel he received						
25	from his attorney, and it would be Judith Hooper who						
	1						

1	had been retained by All American to file certain						
2	documents, and I'm wanting to know whether or not,						
3	because they're now referring to communications and						
4	advice and information they received from their						
5	counsel, is All American waiving the attorney/client						
6	privilege with respect to Ms. Hooper?						
7	MR. GUELKER: No, we're not waiving the						
8	communications that were made. There's a difference						
9	between saying "I relied on counsel's advice" and then						
10	there's that speaks to that, and then also what						
11	specific communications were made.						
12	MR. PROCTOR: Well, that is going to be an						
13	issue. And I think that's all I have at this point.						
14	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Anybody else have any						
15	issues they want to bring up, AT&T or Qwest, about TA?						
16	MR. MECHAM: I have one question about the						
17	in the Docket 06-2469-01, which was the original						
18	application for certificate, there was an original						
19	application and there was a revised application. And						
20	my only source for that has been to go on-line to the						
21	Commission's docket website and pull that stuff off,						
22	and the attachments are blank. So I wonder if I can						
23	get a complete copy of the applications with the						
24	attachments.						
25	MR. GINSBERG: I also noticed that the						
	2						

1 Commission website on that --2 MR. MECHAM: -- runs out. 3 MR. GINSBERG: -- on that docket wasn't 4 complete, it didn't carry through all the way to the --5 you know, to the proceeding. There's actually a third 6 amended application to that. 7 MR. MECHAM: Well, I'd like to see the 8 application. 9 JUDGE ARREDONDO: After this, you can go --10 come to the Commission and we'll help you get what you 11 paper. 12 **MR. MECHAM:** Are they denied for proprietary? 13 MR. GINSBERG: No, no. JUDGE ARREDONDO: Well, some of the 14 attachments are listed as confidential and proprietary. 15 16 MR. GINSBERG: But there's a protective order 17 in this docket, so that shouldn't be a problem. MR. MECHAM: Yeah, I'll have to sign Exhibit-18 A, I haven't signed any, but we can do that. I'll drop 19 20 by the office. JUDGE ARREDONDO: All right. And if you want 21 anything confidential, sign that Exhibit-A and then get 22 23 it to me. 24 MR. MECHAM: Okay. And will that -- if I 25 sign Exhibit-A in this docket, will it cover

1	confidential documents in 06-2469-01?						
2	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Yeah. If not, we can amend						
3	it. We'll put it that you will be bound to that.						
4	MR. MECHAM: All right. I'll take care of						
5	that later.						
6	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Anything else? No? All						
7	right. My plan is to begin at, what did we say, nine?						
8	MR. MECHAM: That's what I've got on my						
9	calendar.						
10	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Nine o'clock. We'll go						
11	every two hours, take a break. If anybody has any						
12	special dietary needs, we'll take a break earlier, or						
13	whatever, for example, diabetes, let me know and we'll						
14	be glad to stop for that condition.						
15	Anything else that we need to discuss? Okay.						
16	Then just to sum up, Mr. Guelker, you'll get back to me						
17	tomorrow morning at nine. And maybe I should have						
18	stated it better. I think the Commission is willing to						
19	consider whether they should move the dates, but again,						
20	their first preference is to keep it to this week and						
21	get done with it.						
22	And then, Mr. Guelker, you'll also send that						
23	information for where the intelligent response was						
24	installed in Garrison						
25	MR. GUELKER: Yes. I do have that.						
	2						

1	JUDGE ARREDONDO: to the committee? And
2	then also the 2007 annual report attachments?
3	MR. GUELKER: I'll do it and see what we
4	have. I can't guarantee I even have them. I just
5	don't want to I may, I just don't know.
6	MR. GINSBERG: And some proof that it had
7	been actually filed, if that exists.
8	JUDGE ARREDONDO: Okay. All right. Thank
9	you.
10	MR. THOMSON BAKER: Thank you, Your Honor.
11	(The hearing concluded at 9:27 a.m.)
