APPLICATION

TeleQuality Communications, Inc. ("TeleQuality" or "Applicant"), by its undersigned counsel and pursuant to Utah Code § 54-8b-1 *et seq.*, Utah Admin. Code R746-349-1 *et seq.*, and the federal Telecommunications Act of 1996, 47 U.S.C. § 151 *et seq.*, hereby submits this application ("Application") to the Utah Public Service Commission (the "Commission") for a certificate of public convenience and necessity ("CPCN") authorizing Applicant to operate as a competitive local exchange carrier ("CLEC") and provide resold and facilities-based intrastate interexchange and non-switched local exchange telecommunications services in the State of Utah.

Because certain financial information of the Applicant is competitively and commercially sensitive, Applicant hereby requests confidential treatment of **Exhibits D** and **E** of this Application. Confidential treatment is requested on the grounds that the information contained therein consists of proprietary financial and commercial information, which is privileged, confidential and prepared only for the use of the Applicant and the regulatory agencies receiving this Application. The Applicant is of the opinion that disclosure of this information would likely result in substantial harm

to the competitive position of the Applicant. Pursuant to standard Commission practice, the

materials submitted with this Application for which Applicant seeks confidential treatment are

printed on yellow paper and marked "CONFIDENTIAL."

II. INFORMATION REQUIRED UNDER UTAH ADMIN. CODE R746-349-3

- 1. **Testimony and Exhibits**. Previous CPCN applications submitted to the Commission indicate the submission of prepared, written testimony in connection with a CLEC application is no longer required. Additionally, pursuant to R746-349-3(A)(1), exhibits in support of this Application are set forth and explained in the following sections.
- 2. **Proof of Bond.** Applicant understands that the bond is intended to provide security for customer deposits or other liabilities to customers of the Applicant. Applicant does not intend to collect customer deposits or offer any prepaid services in Utah. Accordingly, Applicant hereby requests a waiver of this bond requirement.
- 3. *Facilities, Resale of Services*. Applicant intends to provide data telecommunications services over its own facilities, through the use of unbundled network elements purchased from other certified carriers, through the resale of the services of other carriers, or through some combination thereof as determined by market conditions.

4. Services to be Offered.

- a. <u>Classes of Customers</u>. Applicant's initial marketing efforts will be to provide services to both business and residential customers.
- b. <u>Location of Service</u>. Applicant will provide service throughout the State of Utah.
- c. <u>Types of Services to be Offered</u>. Applicant will provide resold and facilities-based intrastate interexchange and non-switched local exchange telecommunications services throughout the State of Utah. Applicant's proposed services include private line data and Internet access services.
- 5. Access to Standard Services. Applicant will provide data telecommunications services only. Therefore, Applicant will not provide access to ordinary intraLATA and interLATA message toll calling, operator services, directory assistance, directory listings, and emergency services such as 911 and E911 either through its own operations or by purchasing those services from third parties.
- 6. *Implementation Schedule Pursuant to 47 U.S.C. § 252(c)(3)*. Applicant intends to begin marketing its services to business and residential customers as soon as the Commission issues a CPCN and Applicant signs any necessary interconnection agreements.
- 7. Professional Experience and Education of Managerial Personnel. Applicant has the managerial and technical qualifications to provide intrastate telecommunications services in Utah. Applicant's management team has considerable experience in network operations, financial analysis/accounting, marketing, sales, customer service, training, regulatory, and other relevant areas. Attached to this Application, as Exhibit B, is a description of the telecommunications experience

and expertise of Applicant's key management personnel. As the biographical information reflects, these individuals have substantial experience in running major telecommunications operations. Each member of Applicant's management team will draw upon his or her own experience, as well as the collective experience of the entire management team, to ensure that TeleQuality is managed and operated effectively, efficiently, and profitably.

- 8. *Organizational Chart*. Attached as **Exhibit C** is an organizational chart of Applicant's employees currently working or who plan to be working for Applicant's Utah operations, with their job titles.
- 9. *Chart of Accounts*. Confidential **Exhibit D** is a chart of accounts for Applicant, including brief descriptions. **Exhibit D** is being submitted in a separate sealed envelope.

10. Financial Statements.

- a. Confidential **Exhibit E** is the most recent balance sheet, income statement and cash-flow statements for TeleQuality Communications, Inc. prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP). **Exhibit E** is being submitted in a separate sealed envelope.
- b. Attached as **Exhibit F** is a letter from Jeff Reynolds, President, attesting to the accuracy, integrity and objectivity of the statements in Exhibit F, and that they were prepared in accordance with GAAP.
- 11. *Financial Ability*. Applicant is financially qualified to provide resold and facilities-based intrastate interexchange and local exchange telecommunications services in the State of Utah. Applicant has current annualized revenues of \$1,000,000, and no debt. Consequently, Applicant has access to the financing and capital necessary to conduct the telecommunications services as specified

in this application. Applicant will rely upon its existing personnel and resources, both technological and financial, to provide intrastate telecommunications services. In particular, Applicant has a positive net worth and there is sufficient cash flow from Applicant's operations to provide the necessary cash flow for Applicant.

12. Expected Operations.

- a. <u>Proforma Projection</u>. Applicant respectfully requests that this requirement be waived because it does not have a projection of its proforma income or cash flow statement for the next five years. In addition, Applicant believes the financial statements provided in **Exhibit E** demonstrate that Applicant has the resources to provide the services identified in this Application.
- b. <u>Technical Description of Technology</u>. Applicant will provide data telecommunications services, specifically private line data and Internet access services. Attached as **Exhibit G** is a diagram illustrating the technologies to be deployed in Utah including types of switches and transmission facilities.
- c. <u>Proposed Facility Locations</u>. Attached as **Exhibit G** is a map of the proposed location of facilities including a description of the specific facilities and services to be deployed at the location.
- 13. *Implementation Schedule Pursuant to 47 U.S.C. § 252(c)(3)*. Applicant intends to begin marketing its services to residential and business customers as soon as the Commission issues a CPCN and Applicant signs any necessary interconnection agreements with incumbent carriers.
- 14. *Other Jurisdictions*. Applicant is currently authorized to provide competitive local exchange telecommunications services in Georgia, California, Missouri, and Washington. Attached

- as **Exhibits H**, **I**, **J**, and **K** are proof of certifications in California, Georgia, Missouri, and Washington. In addition, Applicant is currently authorized to provide resold intrastate interexchange telecommunications services, by virtue of registration or tariff requirements, or on an unregulated basis, in Alabama, Florida, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Mississippi, Montana, Nebraska, Pennsylvania, Texas, Virginia, and Wisconsin. Furthermore, Applicant has never been denied any request for authority to provide telecommunications services.
- Commission approval of this Application. Applicant's proposed services will create and enhance competition and expand customer service options, consistent with the legislative goals set forth in Utah Code § 54-8b-1.1 and the federal Telecommunications Act of 1996. Approval of this Application also will expand the availability of innovative, high quality, reliable and competitively-priced telecommunications services in the State of Utah. Through use of Applicant's own facilities, and through access to many facilities-based carriers operating nationwide, Applicant will be able to select the most economical and efficient non-switched local exchange and interexchange services on a route-specific basis and, thus, can provide customers with a better combination of price, quality, and customer services than other carriers. Accordingly, Applicant anticipates that its proposed service will provide its subscribers with better quality services and will increase consumer choice through innovative, diversified, and reliable service and equipment offerings. Thus, grant of Applicant's petition would promote the public interest in the State of Utah.
- 16. Authority to Do Business in Utah. Attached as Exhibit A is Applicant's Certificate of Existence, which establishes Applicant's authority to conduct business in Utah.
 - 17. Complaints of Unauthorized Switching. No complaints have been made nor has any

investigation been undertaken against Applicant or any other affiliate for unauthorized switching

("slamming") or any other illegal activities.

18. Unauthorized Switching; Solicitation of New Customers. Applicant will provide

data telecommunications services only. Therefore, Applicant will not maintain procedures to prevent

the unauthorized switching of voice customers.

III. **REQUEST FOR CERTIFICATE**

WHEREFORE, Applicant respectfully requests that the Utah Public Service Commission

issue a CPCN authorizing Applicant to provide services in the State of Utah, as set forth in detail in

the body of this Application.





OPINION GRANTING CERTIFICATE OF PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY

1. Summary

TeleQuality Communications, Inc. (Applicant) is granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity (CPCN) pursuant to Pub. Util. Code § 1001 to provide limited facilities-based and resold competitive local exchange and interexchange services, subject to the terms and conditions set forth below. The application is unopposed. This proceeding is closed.

2. Background

In prior decisions, we authorized the provision of competitive interexchange services by carriers meeting specified criteria. In addition, we authorized the provision of competitive local exchange service, by carriers meeting specified criteria, within the service territories of Pacific Bell Telephone Company (Pacific), Verizon California Inc. (Verizon), SureWest Telephone (SureWest), and Citizens Telecommunications Company of California, Inc., dba Frontier Communications of California (CTC).

Applicant's legal name is TeleQuality Communications, Inc. Applicant is a Texas Corporation and its principal place of business is located at 24715 Fairway Springs, San Antonio, Texas, 78260. The telephone number is (210) 408-0388.

3. Financial Qualifications

To be granted a CPCN, an applicant for authority to provide facilities-based and resold local exchange and interexchange services must demonstrate that it has a minimum of \$100,000 cash or cash equivalent to meet the firm's start-up expenses.¹ An applicant must also demonstrate that it has sufficient additional resources to cover all deposits required by local exchange carriers and/or interexchange carriers (IECs) in order to provide the proposed service.² Applicant provided its most recent financial statement that demonstrates that it has sufficient cash to satisfy this financial requirement.

4. Technical Qualifications

Applicants for Non-Dominant Interexchange Carrier (NDIEC) and Competitive Local Carrier (CLC) authority are required to make a reasonable showing of technical expertise in telecommunications or a related business. Applicant submitted biographical information on its officers that demonstrates that it possesses sufficient experience and knowledge to operate as a telecommunications provider.

¹ The financial requirement for CLCs is contained in Decision (D.) 95-12-056, Appendix C. The financial requirement for NDIECs is contained in D.91-10-041.

² The requirement for CLC applicants to demonstrate that they have additional financial resources to meet any deposits required by underlying local exchange carriers and/or IECs is set forth in D.95-12-056, Appendix C. For NDIECs, the requirement is found in D.93-05-010.

Applicant represents that no one associated with or employed by Applicant as an affiliate, officer, director, partner, or owner of more than 10% of Applicant was previously associated with any telecommunication carrier that filed for bankruptcy, or was sanctioned by the Federal Communications Commission or any state regulatory agency for failure to comply with any regulatory statute, rule or order.

5. Tariff

Commission staff reviewed Applicant's draft tariffs for compliance with Commission rules and regulations. The deficiencies to be corrected by Applicant are set forth in Attachment A.

6. California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)

CEQA requires the Commission as the designated lead agency to assess the potential environmental impact of a project in order that adverse effects are avoided, alternatives are investigated, and environmental quality is restored or enhanced to the fullest extent possible. Applicant has no plan for constructing facilities at this time. Applicant will provide its service through the use of existing facilities and network elements of other carriers and/or its own facilities installed in existing buildings and structures. Therefore, it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that granting this application will have an adverse effect upon the environment. Applicant must file for additional authority, and submit to any required CEQA review, before it can construct facilities.

7. Conclusion

We conclude that the application conforms to our rules for authority to provide resold competitive local exchange and interexchange

telecommunications services. Accordingly, we shall approve the application subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein.

8. Categorization and Need for Hearings

In Resolution ALJ 176-3207, dated January 31, 2008, the Commission preliminarily categorized this application as Ratesetting, and preliminarily determined that hearings were not necessary. No protests have been received. There is no apparent reason why the application should not be granted. Given these developments, a public hearing is not necessary, and it is not necessary to disturb the preliminary determinations.

9. Comments on Proposed Decision

This is an uncontested matter in which the decision grants the relief requested. Accordingly, pursuant to Section 311(g)(2) of the Pub. Util. Code and Rule 14.6(c)(2) of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, the otherwise applicable 30-day period for public review and comment is waived.

10. Assignment of Proceeding

Rachelle B. Chong is the assigned Commissioner and Bertram D. Patrick is the assigned Administrative Law Judge in this proceeding.

Findings of Fact

- Notice of the application appeared on the Daily Calendar on January 25, 2008.
 - 2. No protests have been filed.
 - 3. A hearing is not required.
- 4. In prior decisions, the Commission authorized competition in providing interexchange services for carriers meeting specific criteria.

- In prior decisions, the Commission authorized competition, by carriers meeting specified criteria, in providing local exchange telecommunications services within the service territories of Pacific, Verizon, SureWest and CTC.
- Applicant has a minimum of \$100,000 of cash or cash equivalent that is reasonably liquid and readily available to meet its start-up expenses.
- Applicant has sufficient additional cash or cash equivalent to cover any deposits that may be required by other telecommunications carriers in order to provide the proposed service.
- Applicant possesses sufficient experience and knowledge to provide telecommunications services.
- 9. As part of its application, Applicant submitted a draft of its initial tariff that contained the deficiencies listed in Attachment A to this decision. Except for these deficiencies, Applicant's draft tariff complies with the Commission's requirements.
 - 10. Applicant will not be constructing facilities.

Conclusions of Law

- Applicant has the financial ability to provide the proposed service.
- Applicant has sufficient technical expertise to operate as a telecommunications carrier.
- Public convenience and necessity require that Applicant's resold competitive local exchange and interexchange services be subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein.
- Since Applicant will not be constructing any facilities, it can be seen with certainty that there will be no significant effect on the environment.
 - 5. The application should be granted to the extent set forth below.

- Applicant, once granted a CPCN, should be subject to the applicable Commission rules, decisions, General Orders, and statutes that pertain to California's public utilities.
- Applicant's initial tariff filing should correct the deficiencies noted in its draft tariffs as indicated in Attachment A to this decision.
- Because of the public interest in competitive local exchange and interexchange services, the following order should be effective immediately.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

- A certificate of public convenience and necessity is granted to
 TeleQuality Communications, Inc. (Applicant) to operate as a limited
 facilities-based and resale provider of competitive local exchange services, and
 interexchange services, subject to the terms and conditions set forth below.
- Applicant is authorized to provide local exchange service in the service territories of Pacific Bell Telephone Company, Verizon California Inc., SureWest Telephone, and Citizens Telecommunications Company of California, Inc.
- 3. Applicant is authorized to file tariff schedules for the provision of competitive local exchange services and interexchange services with the deficiencies noted in Attachment A corrected. Applicant may not offer services until tariffs are on file. Applicant's initial filing shall be made in accordance with General Order (GO) 96-B and the Telecommunications Industry Rules (D.07-09-019). Applicant shall comply with its tariffs.
- 4. The certificate granted, and the authority to render service under the rates, charges and rules authorized, will expire if not exercised within 12 months after the effective date of this order.

- The corporate identification number assigned to Applicant, U7075C, shall be included in the caption of all original filings with this Commission, and in the titles of other pleadings filed in existing cases.
- 6. Applicant shall comply with all applicable rules adopted in the Local Exchange Competitive proceeding (Rulemaking 95-04-043/Investigation 95-04-044), the Commission's rules and regulations for nondominant interexchange carriers set forth in Decision (D.) 93-05-010, D.90-08-032, as well as all other applicable Commission rules, decisions, GOs, and statutes that pertain to California public utilities, subject to the exemptions granted in this decision.
- 7. Applicant shall comply with the requirements applicable to competitive local exchange carriers and non-dominant interexchange carriers included in Attachment B to this decision.
- Applicant is not authorized to construct facilities other than those to be installed in existing building and structures.

ORDER APPROVING INTEREXCHANGE AND NONSWITCHED LOCAL EXCHANGE CERTIFICATES OF SERVICE AUTHORITY AND ORDER APPROVING TARIFF

Issue Date: May 9, 2008 Effective Date: May 19, 2008

Syllabus: This order grants TeleQuality Communications, Inc., (TeleQuality) a certificate of service authority to provide interexchange and nonswitched local exchange telecommunications services, restricted to providing dedicated private line services, and approves the company's proposed tariff.

TeleQuality Communications, Inc., (TeleQuality) applied to the Missouri Public Service Commission on April 4, 2008, for certificates of service authority to provide intrastate interexchange and nonswitched local exchange telecommunications services in Missouri under Sections 392.410, RSMo Supp. 2005, through 392.450, RSMo 2000. TeleQuality asked the Commission to classify it as a competitive company and to waive certain statutes and rules as authorized by Sections 392.361 and 392.420. TeleQuality is a Texas corporation with its principal office located at 24715 Fairway Springs, San Antonio, Texas 78260.

The Commission issued a Notice of Applications for Intrastate Certificates of Service Authority and Opportunity to Intervene on April 7, 2008, directing parties wishing to intervene to file their requests by April 22, 2008. No requests for intervention were filed.

TeleQuality filed a proposed tariff in conjunction with its application and filed

substitute sheets on April 25, 2008. The tariff's effective date is May 19, 2008. TeleQuality's tariff describes the rates, rules, and regulations it intends to use, identifies TeleQuality as a competitive company, and lists the waivers requested. TeleQuality intends to provide interexchange and nonswitched local exchange telecommunications services.

In its memorandum filed on May 7, 2008, the Staff of the Commission recommended that the Commission grant TeleQuality a certificate of interexchange service authority, and a certificate of service authority for local exchange telecommunications services on condition that this authority be restricted to providing dedicated private line services. Staff recommended that the Commission grant TeleQuality competitive status, and waiver of the statutes and rules listed in the Notice. Staff recommended that the Commission approve the proposed tariff as amended to become effective on May 19, 2008.

The Commission finds that competition in the intrastate interexchange and nonswitched local exchange telecommunications markets is in the public interest and TeleQuality shall be granted certificates of service authority. The Commission finds that the services TeleQuality proposes to offer are competitive and TeleQuality shall be classified as a competitive company. The Commission finds that waiving the statutes and Commission rules set out in the ordered paragraph below is reasonable and not detrimental to the public interest.

The Commission finds that TeleQuality 's proposed tariff details the services, equipment, and pricing it proposes to offer, and is similar to tariffs approved for other Missouri certificated interexchange and nonswitched local exchange carriers. The Commission finds that the proposed tariff filed on April 4, 2008, shall be approved as amended to become effective on May 19, 2008.

The Commission reminds the company that failure to comply with its regulatory obligations may result in the assessment of penalties against it. These regulatory obligations include, but are not limited to, the following:

A) The obligation to file an annual report, as established by Section 392.210, RSMo 2000. Failure to comply with this obligation will make the utility liable to a penalty of \$100 per day for each day that the violation continues. 4 CSR 240-3.540 requires

telecommunications utilities to file their annual report on or before April 15 of each year.

- B) The obligation to pay an annual assessment fee established by the Commission, as required by Section 386.370, RSMo 2000.
- C) The obligation to comply with all relevant laws and regulations, as well as orders issued by the Commission. If the company fails to comply, it is subject to penalties for noncompliance ranging from \$100 to \$2,000 per day of noncompliance, pursuant to Section 386.570, RSMo 2000.
- D) The obligation to keep the Commission informed of its current address and telephone number.

Furthermore, the company is reminded that, if it is a corporation, non-attorneys may not represent the company before the Commission. Instead, the corporation must be represented by an attorney licensed to practice law in Missouri.

In addition, the company is reminded that Section 392.410.5, RSMo Supp. 2007, renders the company's certificate of service authority null and void one year from the date of this order unless it has exercised its authority under that certificate.

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- TeleQuality Communications, Inc., is granted a certificate of service authority to provide intrastate interexchange telecommunications services in the state of Missouri, subject to the conditions of certification set out above.
- TeleQuality Communications, Inc., is granted a certificate of service authority to
 provide nonswitched local exchange telecommunications services in the state of Missouri limited to
 providing dedicated private line services, subject to all applicable statutes and Commission rules except
 as specified in this order.
- The certification granted herein is conditioned upon the company's compliance with the regulatory obligations in this order.
- 4. TeleQuality Communications, Inc., is classified as a competitive telecommunications company. Application of the following statutes and regulatory rules shall be waived:
