Dear Ms. Orchard:

By this letter Qwest is requesting a waiver of the threshold requirements outlined in FCC's Numbering Resource Optimization Orders, FCC 00-429 and FCC 01-362 released in CC Docket No 99-200, which would allow PA/NeuStar, the Number Pooling Administrator, to provide 2 thousands blocks for a Qwest customer in the Utah 385 Salt Lake Rate Center.

The request is for 2 thousands blocks (2,000 telephone numbers) in the 385 NPA, Salt Lake Rate Center, to meet the specific needs of a customer in the community. The customer is requesting 2,000 sequential telephone numbers in blocks that do not start with a 0, 1, or 9. Qwest cannot satisfy this customer request for 385 NPA numbers with our existing numbering inventory and currently there are no 385 NPA blocks available for assignment in NeuStar's industry pool inventory for the Salt Lake Rate Center, therefore a new 385 NXX will have to be opened. Qwest is requesting that authorization be granted so that NeuStar can open and assign two compatible blocks to Qwest for the customer. Qwest will retain two of the blocks from the new NXX code and donate the other eight blocks to the Number Pool inventory.

In order to satisfy the customer's request, Qwest submitted a request for the numbers to PA/NeuStar on March 12, 2009, which was immediately denied based on Qwest's Months to Exhaust (MTE) and Rate Center Utilization. In order for the request to be approved, Qwest will require a waiver of the current FCC utilization thresholds for new numbering requests. The original customer request has been provided with this letter as a confidential attachment.

The FCC allows for a waiver of the rules when there is demonstrated need such as a specific customer request for a large block of numbers. The waiver process is specifically addressed in the FCC Third Report and Order ("Order") as the "safety valve" process (See FCC 01-362, paras. 57-66), which went into effect on March 14, 2002. The Order delegates the authority to hear claims for waivers to the state commissioners and recommends that state commissions act expeditiously. The Order proposes that state commissions review a waiver within 10 business days. (See Paras. 61,66)


