Dear Ms. Orchard:

By this letter Qwest is requesting a waiver of the threshold requirements outlined in FCC's Numbering Resource Optimization Orders, FCC 00-429 and FCC 01-362 released in CC Docket No 99-200, which would allow PA/NeuStar, the Number Pooling Administrator, to provide one block (1,000 numbers) for a Qwest customer in the Utah 385 Provo Rate Center.

The request is for one block (1,000 telephone numbers) in the 385 NPA, Provo Rate Center, to meet the specific needs of a customer in the community. The customer is requesting that the new block be 385-NXX in either the 1XXX or 2XXX range so it can be integrated easily into their existing dialing plan. Qwest is requesting that authorization be granted so that NeuStar can assign the requested block to Qwest for the customer, which will require a new 385 NXX be opened in the Provo Rate Center.

In order to satisfy the customer's request, Qwest submitted a request for the numbers to PA/NeuStar on May 1, 2009, which was immediately denied based on Qwest's Months to Exhaust (MTE) and Utilization Rate. In order for the request to be approved, Qwest will require a waiver of the current MTE and Utilization threshold for new numbering requests. The original customer request has been provided with this letter as a confidential attachment.

The FCC allows for a waiver of the rules when there is demonstrated need such as a specific customer request for a large block of numbers. The waiver process is specifically addressed in the FCC Third Report and Order ("Order") as the "safety valve" process (See FCC 01-362, paras. 57-66), which went into effect on March 14, 2002. The Order delegates the authority to hear claims for waivers to the state commissioners and recommends that state commissions act expeditiously. The Order proposes that state commissions review a waiver within 10 business days. (See Paras. 61,66)


Qwest respectfully requests that the Commission approve the request for a waiver of Months to Exhaust threshold and Utilization Rate requirements and direct PA/NeuStar to open a new 385 NXX code and assign the requested block in the Utah 385 Provo Rate Center to allow Qwest to meet this specific customer request for a new block (1,000 numbers).
