Re: Agreement for Local Resale Service between Citizens Telecommunications of Utah (Moab Only) and BullsEye Telecom, Inc.

Dear Ms. Orchard:

Citizens Telecommunications Company of Utah, Inc., d/b/a Frontier Communications of Utah ("Frontier"), and BullsEye Telecom, Inc. ("BullsEye") hereby submit for approval the enclosed "Agreement for Local Resale Service" signed by Frontier on March 3, 2010, (the "Agreement"), which provides for BullsEye to obtain Frontier's retail services in the Moab Exchange at a wholesale discount. This Agreement was reached through voluntary negotiations without resort to mediation or arbitration and is submitted for approval pursuant to Section 252(e) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended by the Telecommunications Act of 1996 ("the Act"), and the requirements of Utah Code Ann. 54-8b-2.2(1)(d)(i).

Section 252(e)(2) of the Act directs that a state Commission may reject an agreement reached through voluntary negotiations only if the commission finds that

- 1. the agreement (or portion thereof) discriminates against a telecommunications carrier not a party to the agreement; or
- 2. the implementation of such agreement or portion is not consistent with the public interest, convenience and necessity.

Frontier and BullsEye respectfully submit that the Agreement provides no basis for either of these findings and, thus, request that the Commission approve the Agreement expeditiously. First, the Agreement does not discriminate against any other telecommunications carrier because Frontier has made the terms of the Agreement available to other carriers. Second, the Agreement is consistent with the public interest as identified in the pro-competitive policies of the State of Utah, this Commission, the U.S. Congress and the Federal Communications Commission. Agreement will enable BullsEye to provide service to a greater number of telecommunications customers in Utah than it does today. Expeditious approval of this Agreement will facilitate immediate competition in the wireline telecommunications market.

Frontier and BullsEye further request that the Commission approve this Agreement without a hearing and without allowing the intervention of other parties. Because this Agreement was reached through voluntary negotiations, it does not raise issues requiring a hearing and does not concern other parties not a part of the negotiations. Expeditious approval would further the public interest.
