To the Commission:

In accordance with R746-405 of the Public Service Commission's Rules, Central Utah Telephone, Inc. ("Central Utah") hereby files the original and five (5) copies of the following Tariff Sheet of Central Utah's Local Tariff on file with the Commission:

1. 2nd Revised Tariff Sheet No. 29.1, canceling 1st Revised Sheet No. 29.1

On August 8, 2013, the Public Service Commission (the "Commission") issued an Order Granting Motion for Clarification of Commission Orders, in which the Commission identified its specific concerns regarding Central Utah's 2nd Revised Tariff Sheet No. 29.1. Specifically, the Commission indicated that: 1) further evaluation is needed because the proposed language can still be interpreted to allow the Companies to discontinue service unilaterally; 2) it believed the reference to May 31, 2013 should have been deleted or amended; and 3) it may not be just, reasonable, or in the public interest to prohibit an existing emergency line customer from moving his or her service to a different location.

Central Utah appreciates receiving the August 8, 2013 Order from the Commission. In an attempt to address the Commission's concerns, and to avoid a costly and time consuming

hearing, Central Utah hereby files a new 2nd Revised Sheet No. 29.1, which modifies the proposed tariff language to make it clear that it was never Central Utah's intent to discontinue a tariffed service without participating in the proper Commission procedure, which would include filing a proposed tariff revision with the Commission for approval. As now drafted, the language cannot be interpreted to permit Central Utah to unilaterally discontinue the service, and will require that Central Utah engage in the proper tariff procedures with the Commission.

Additionally, Central Utah has removed the reference to May 31, 2013, and has made it clear that customers who have emergency line service at the time this tariff revision is approved shall be entitled to retain such service. Finally, the modified language in 2nd Revised Sheet No. 29.1 affirmatively provides that grandfathered emergency line service customers are permitted to move their emergency line service to another location.

Central Utah believes these language modifications address the Commission's concerns as set forth in the August 8, 2013 Order, and will obviate the need for a hearing on August 29, 2013.
